The 1988 edition of Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges will include the names of 14 students from the University of Southern Indiana who have been selected as national outstanding campus leaders.

Campus nominating committees and editors of the annual directory have included the names of these students based on their academic achievement, service to the community, leadership in extracurricular activities, and potential for continued success.

The USI students join an elite group selected from more than 1,400 institutions of higher learning in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and several foreign nations.

Gregory W. Biggs of 719 Treelane Drive, Newburgh, who is president of the USI Psychology Club and a member of the Psi Chi National Honor Society in Psychology, USI Social Work Club, and Pi Kappa Alpha National Social Fraternity. His activities have included being a student worker in the Division of Social Science, co-chairman of the Mid-America Psychology Conference, and a member of the Social Science Advisory Board at USI, the St. Johns Men's Club at Newburgh, and the Evansville Zoological Society. He is certified as a lifeguard, water safety instructor, and adapted aquatics instructor, and in first aid and CPR. Aside from being named to the USI Dean's List, Biggs was presented the Academic Achievement Award for 1986-87 in the USI Department of Psychology. He has a 3.6 overall grade point average out of a possible 4.0.

Steven B.
