PEOPLE IN THE NEWS. Sang T. Choe, assistant professor of Business, will present a paper titled "The Concept of High-and-Low Context Culture for Better Understanding in International Marketing," at the annual meeting of the Academy of International Business in New York City on October 7.

Kathy Deppen and Judy McCune, students of Dr. Joe Palladino, have completed a survey of more than 600 people to determine public attitudes toward drinking drivers and the willingness of individuals to assess various penalties for accidents caused by those drivers. The results of the survey are the basis for a paper presented recently at the American Psychological Association's convention in California. The paper was written by Dr. Palladino and his associate at IU Southeast, Dr. Bernardo Carducci, who attended the convention to present the paper. The paper reveals a majority of the people surveyed believe harsh punishments are inappropriate for drunk drivers even if they are involved in an accident in which someone is killed. Accounts of the study have been carried on the Associated Press wire service and printed in newspapers in Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Bloomington, and Louisville.
