LOCAL ATTORNEYS CHAIR ISUE ALUMNI TELEFUND. Two local attorneys, David A. Bunner and David E. Gray, are chairing the ninth annual ISUE Alumni Telefund Drive which begins this week. Over 3700 alumni of ISUE will be contacted during the event.

The co-chairmen have recruited more than 100 alumni volunteers to assist in the telephone campaign. Proceeds from the Telefund will benefit the alumni scholarship program and other philanthropic projects of the Alumni Association.

Bunner, a 1972 graduate of ISUE and a 1978 graduate of Drake University Law School, has a private law practice in Evansville and serves as corporate counsel for the city. Gray graduated from ISUE in 1974 and received his law degree in 1977 from Indiana University School of Law. He is associated with the Evansville law firm of Bowers, Harrison, and Kent.

A MESSAGE FROM LIBRARY SERVICES. ISUE Library Services, in cooperation with the ISU Cunningham Memorial Library, now offers computerized reference services. More than 120 databases or indexes on machine-readable form covering primarily periodical literature are available. Two of the services are specifically related to Indiana. Indiana Information Retrieval System (INDIRS) provides social and economic data pertaining only to Indiana. Training and Educational Data Service (TEDS) provides information on careers, employment prospects and on-the-job opportunities. Career information pertains to the nation in general and for Indiana specifically.

Before contacting Terre Haute, ISUE library personnel will interview the potential user to define topics and identify desired information. The service usually takes about 10 days and is available only through the ISUE Library. The charges, while significant, will be the same for our campus as those at Terre Haute.

ICON IS HERE! An acronym for IHETS Conference Network, ICON provides an inexpensive, flexible, and convenient method of conducting meetings by telephone. Developed by IHETS engineers, this system allows for more effective use of the statewide SUVON telephone network. A conference may be scheduled by any IHETS member institution, but the participants may be anywhere in the world, as long as they have a telephone with which to call the network.

Use of ICON meetings in lieu of face-to-face meetings can result in substantial savings in departmental travel budgets as well as staff time out of the office. Geographically speaking, we at ISUE stand to benefit more than institutions centrally located in Indiana. More details on ICON are available from Media Services, extension 1888.
