ANOTHER RECORD ENROLLMENT AT ISUE. This fall's enrollment was a record 3,664 compared to last year's 3,586--a two percent increase. The total includes 2,127 full-time students and 1,537 part-time students. ISUE had 2,923 students enrolled five years ago, 2,624 students enrolled ten years ago, and 922 students enrolled 15 years ago. Enrollment figures by class are listed below.

MESSAGE FROM THE COMPUTER CENTER: The Computer Center announces the purchase of a PRIME model 750 mini-computer to be used for academic computing at ISUE. The mini-computer will be delivered sometime in December, and the installation is planned for the start of the spring semester. The PRIME computer is configured with three megabytes of memory, 64 terminal ports, and two 300 megabyte disk drives. Computer languages available on the PRIME will be BASIC, FORTRAN, COBOL, and at a later date--PASCAL.
