VISITING ARTIST PROGRAM, OCTOBER 26 - 30. Phyllis Bramson, a figurative painter, will be the first of four visiting artists brought to ISUE for week-long workshops. Each of the four workshops are sponsored by the ISUE Art Department and a grant from the Indiana Arts Commission and the National Endowment for the Arts.

The Chicago-based artist will present a lecture at the Evansville Museum of Arts and Sciences on October 26 at 8:00 p.m. for students and the community. The title of her lecture is "The Figure Is Alive and Well and Living in the Midwest". A slide presentation and discussion of the artist's work as well as other Midwestern artists whose

Ms. Bramson has had numerous one-person shows in Chicago and New York, where she is represented by Monique Knowlton Gallery. Recently, she has shown her work in Gallerie Farideh Cadot in Paris. She has received fellowship grants from the Illinois Arts Council, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Louis Comfort Tiffany Grant. Her paintings, drawings, and prints have been exhibited in the Smithsonian, the Art Institute of Chicago, the Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago, and the New Museum in New York.

The visiting artist program at ISUE was established to bring to the campus and to the community of Evansville artists of national reputation for workshops, lectures, and demonstrations. Further information about the program may be obtained by calling the Division of Humanities at extension 1734.
