About USI





Location

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

The Campus

The Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, the Education Center, and the Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, the University Center, the Liberal Arts Center, the Technology Center, and the Business and Engineering Center, now under construction, form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation and Fitness Center, which is undergoing a substantial addition, are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,700 students who live on campus.

Academic Life

The University enrolls 10,126 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

Campus Life

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.

Residence Life

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suite-style housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular to students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

Financial Assistance

USI provides families with an affordable way to higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.

2009 Outlook

The University of Southern Indiana women's soccer team hopes to follow an offensive explosion to success in the 2009 season.

USI Head Coach **Krissy Engelbrecht** enters her seventh season with a team loaded with 13 returning players that

include 96 percent of last year's offensive production. The Screaming Eagles also have nine new players that add depth to both the offensive and defensive side of the field.

FORWARDS:

Up front the Eagles have five returning players, led by third team All-GLVC sophomore **Meagan Kempf**. Kempf led the team and tied for 10th in the GLVC with 19 points on a team-best eight goals and three assists. She also scored the gamewinning goal in three of the five USI victories a year ago.

Kempf is joined up front by sophomore **Nancy Newcomer**, who started 11 of her 16 matches during her first season with the Eagles. Newcomer finished the year with nine points on four goals and one assist, including the game winning goal against Oakland City University.

The Eagles also return seniors Rachel Caksackkar, Jenna Kuesch, and Ka-

tie Teagarden. Teagarden tied for first on the team with four assists a year ago, while scoring one goal to finish the year with six total points. Caksackkar, who has played multiple positions during her Eagle career, had one assist in 2008.

To add depth to the offensive side of the field, Engelbrecht and USI have added three new players – freshmen **Cheyenne Bracken**, **Kelly Fitzgerald**, and **Susan Ellsperman** -- for 2009.

Bracken joins the Eagles following four seasons on the Warren Central High School soccer team. She was second team All-State last fall in addition to being named Indianapolis Star All-County. Bracken was named first team All-State, All-County, All-Conference, and All-District in 2007.



Fitzgeragld comes to USI after lettering in soccer and track at Cathedral High School. She helped lead CHS to regional, sectional, and city championships in 2007 and 2008 and was a member of the CHS state championship team in 2007.



2008 All-GLVC sophomore forward Meagan Kempf

Ellsperman, who lettered in soccer and track at Memorial High School, was a first team All-State selection and the Evansville Player of the Year in 2008. The forward/midfielder also received NSCAA All-Region honors last fall after posting 68 points on 22 goals and 24 assists.

MIDFIELDERS

The Eagles have a solid pair of returning seniors in **Shauni Boudia** and **Kara Georgeff** to anchor the midfield. Boudia was second on the team last fall with 12 points, tying for first with four assists and second with four goals.

Georgeff battled back from a knee injury during her sophomore season to start all 17 matches as a junior. She also was fourth on the team in scoring with a career-high seven points on two goals and three assists.

The Eagles are supplementing the midfield corps with sophomore transfer **Haley Hancock** and freshman **Paige**

Nuelle. Hancock comes to the Eagle program from the University of Evansville, where she started her collegiate career with the Purple Aces.

Nuelle comes to USI after winning three letters in basketball and soccer at Kirkwood High School. The 2008 first team All-Conference performer helped KHS to a Missouri state championship in 2006 and to three straight Midwest Regional League titles.

DEFENDERS:

The Eagles are young on the defensive side of the field with four returning defenders and five freshmen.

Leading the returning players is senior sweeper **Alison Conquest**. Conquest started all 17 matches for the Eagles

in 2009 and also added to the USI offense by recording three points on one goal and one assist.

Also returning in the USI backfield are sophomores **Carrie Grochowski** and **Samantha Smith**. Growchowski also helped out on the offensive side with three points of her own on one goal and one assist.

The Eagles also plan to add speed to the backfield when they switch sophomore **Lavonia Lewis** from forward to defender. Lewis tied for seventh in scoring as a freshman with three points on one goal and one assist.

New to the defensive side aree freshmen Morgyn Graber, Brittany McCall, and Jessica Gates.

McCall was a four-time All-City and All-SIAC defender at Memorial. She also was named All-District as a junior in 2007 and Academic All-City all four seasons.

Gates was a 2008 third team All-State performer from Lake Central High School. She also was the LCHS Defensive Most Valuable Player in 2007 and 2008, while earning All-Duneland Athletic Conference and first team All-District honors the last two seasons.

GOALKEEPERS:

The Eagles are experienced between the posts with sophomores **Stephanie Bodamer** and **Chelsea Connell**. Bodamer started all but one match during her first season, posting a 2.03 goals against average with 101 saves and two shutouts in 16 matches.

Connell posted a win in her only start of the year, giving the Eagles a season-ending victory over Lewis University.

Head Coach Krissy Engelbrecht

Krissy Engelbrecht is entering her seventh season as the head coach of the USI women's soccer program. In her first six seasons, Engelbrecht has accumulated a record of 37-63-5 overall.

Engelbrecht also led the 2005 Eagles to their first GLVC Tournament appearance since 2000.

Engelbrecht came to USI from the University of Evansville where she was an assistant coach. Under former Evansville head coach Mick Lyon, Engelbrecht helped

direct the Aces to the Missouri Valley Conference Championship in 2001.

In the community, she is the director of player development for the Blitz/Lady Blitz soccer organization.

Engelbrecht was an outstanding player for Evansville prior to becoming a coach. She was a three-time Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year and All-Great Lakes Region team member, leading the Aces to four straight MVC titles and two NCAA Division I Tournament appearances. She was named to the MVC Hall of Fame in 2006 and the Evansville Hall of Fame in 2007.

Engelbrecht lives in Evansville with husband, Jeff, a former USI baseball player, and their son Aidan.

Kara Sergesketter Assistant Coach

Kara Sergesketter '07 makes her debut as a member of the USI women's soccer coaching staff in 2009, assisting Head Coach Krissy Engelbrecht.

Sergesketter joins the USI staff with coaching experience at the club and

junior high school level. She has coached the Evansville Lady Blitz (2004-05), the Evansville Elite (2006-07), and Castle Junior High School (2007-08), in addition to being employed as personal trainer at Bob's Gym.

Sergesketter played four seasons with the Screaming Eagles before joining the coaching ranks and was a second generation USI student athlete, following in her mother's (Patty Marcum) footsteps. She played in 66 matches for the Eagles, making 46 starts, while recording 15 points on three goals and nine assists.

The Evansville, Indiana, native and graduate of Reitz High School earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science in 2007. She and her husband Dustin reside in Newburgh, Indiana.



Owen McCarthy Assistant Coach

Owen McCarthy begins his first season at USI as an assistant coach for the women's soccer team. He began his collegiate coaching career last season as a men's soccer student assistant.

McCarthy holds a USSF "D" coaching license after directing the southern Indiana district team to the Olympic Development Program. A former assistant at Memorial High School (Evansville, Indiana), he is a member of the Evansville Soccer Club coaching staff.

Prior to beginning his collegiate coaching career last year, McCarthy was a cadet at the United State Military Academy and was a member of Army's Division I soccer team in 2004-05. His collegiate soccer career was cut short after his freshman season due to injury.

McCarthy was a starting midfielder at the U.S. Military Academy Preparatory School (Mt. Monmouth, New Jersey) and spent a semester in residence training at the IMG Soccer Academy.

A Memorial High School graduate, McCarthy was a fouryear member of the varsity soccer team and was a part of the Tigers' 2002 IHSAA soccer championship. He also was a starter on the Indiana ODP State Team that won the ODP Region II championship.


