#### JULY FOURTH HOLIDAY OBSERVANCE

#### TRI-STATE CHESS OPEN AT ISUE

The Tri-State Chess Open, a chess tournament sponsored by the Chess Club of Indiana State University, Evansville, will be held on August 5 beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the Forum Room at ISUE. According to Mike Salm, the tournament chairman, the Chess Open will be run on a Swiss basis.

Three age group categories will be designated for the tournament. Class A is for participants 27 and older; Class B for participants 19-26; and Class C for participants under 19 years. Fees for each category are:

Class A - \$2.00 pre-registration  
\$2.75 registration at door

Class B - \$1.50 pre-registration  
\$2.25 registration at door

Class C - \$1.00 pre-registration  
\$1.75 registration at door

Everyone is eligible to enter the Tri-State Chess Open. The sponsors are requesting that entrants bring their own chess set if it is a standard chess set.

Six awards, two in each class, will be given. Registration blanks and further details about the Chess Open are available from Mike Salm, 616 S. St. James Blvd., phone 477-1776. Refreshments will be available at the Evansville Campus.

Other activities throughout the Freedom Festival include the Freedom Festival parade consisting of 80 units on July 2 at 4:00 p.m. The parade will march on the walkway in downtown Evansville.

Regional championship boat races will be run on the Ohio River opposite Dress Plaza with time trials beginning at 1:00 p.m. July 1. Actual races will take place on Sunday, July 2 at 1:00 p.m.

And on the night of July 4, at 9:00 p.m., a fireworks display -- the largest in Indiana - will be staged on the river front.

The Evansville Civic Theatre is presenting the midwest premiere performance of American Primitive: The Words of John and Abigail Adams on July 1, as part of the Evansville Freedom Festival.

Performances of the play will be held on July 1 and 4 at 2:30 p.m. matinees and on July 1, 2, and 3 at 8:15 p.m. at the First Presbyterian Church Auditorium. The play is based on correspondence between the Adamses during the Continental Congress from 1774 to 1777 and contains the expressions of a wife and mother while her husband is at war plus John Adams' thoughts as one separated from home and family.
