The New Harmony Theatre will open the 1997 season Friday evening with the recent Broadway smash hit and Tony Award-winning musical *She Loves Me*.

This charming show from the creators of *Fiddler on the Roof*, with book by Joe Masteroff, lyrics by Sheldon Harnick, music by Jerry Block, will be presented at 7:30 p.m. Thursdays, 8 p.m. Fridays, 2 and 8 p.m. Saturdays, and 2 p.m. Sundays, June 13 through June 29, at Murphy Auditorium.

Other 1997 productions will be Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, July 11-27; the *Stardust* musical revue, August 1-17; and A.R. Gurney's comedy, *The Golden Age*, August 22-31.

Season tickets are \$48 each; regular admission will be \$14, adult; \$13, senior citizens (60-plus); \$12 each, groups of 20 or more. Features will be Thursday family nights (children 8 to 18, \$5, with an

Lincoln Amphitheatre

The 11th annual production of the outdoor musical *Young Abe Lincoln*, a depiction of the life of the 16th President while he lived in southern Indiana from age 7 to 21, will open at 8 p.m. Friday, June 20, at Lincoln Amphitheatre near Lincoln City, Indiana.

The musical will be joined July 10 by the Rodgers and Hammerstein classic, *Oklahoma!* The two outdoor musicals then will be presented on alternate nights until the season finale of *Young Abe* on Saturday, August 16.

Performances will be at 8 p.m. daily, Tuesday through Sunday; matinee performances are scheduled at 1:30 p.m. Thursdays, July 24 and 31 and August 7. (The amphitheatre is closed Mondays, and also will be closed July 4 and 6-8-9, as the cast prepares for *Oklahoma!*)

Season tickets are \$25 each, unlimited attendance. Regular admission will be \$12, adults; \$7, children (under 13); \$10,
