USI Chamber Choir in concert October 20

The USI Chamber Choir, a vocal ensemble from the University of Southern Indiana, will present a fall concert at 3 p.m. on Sunday, October 20 in St. Joseph Catholic Church, 600 East Virginia.

The fall concert, free and open to the public, will explore a variety of eclectic repertory for mixed chorus.

The program includes "Zadok the Priest" by George Fredric Handel; "Exultate Deo" by Alessandro Scarlatti; "Alleluia" by Ralph Manuel; "Totus Tuus" by Henryk Mikolaj Gorecki; "O Magnum Mysterium" and "Dirait On" by Morten Lauridsen; "Feller from Fortune," arranged by Harry Sommers; "One by One," arranged by John Leavitt; and "Praise His Holy Name" by Keith Hampton.

The chamber choir is conducted by Daniel R. Craig, USI assistant professor of music. Craig is in his 13th year as director of choirs at USI. He holds degrees from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana and Murray State University.

The USI Chamber Choir, a 35-voice ensemble, has performed in venues throughout Indiana and has toured in Poland, Germany, Ireland, and Canada.
