## Jon Mark Hall, Director of Athletics



Jon Mark Hall was appointed to the position of director of Athletics in January 2002, after seven years as the assistant director.

Under his direction, USI was the 2003-04 GLVC All-Sports and Commissioner's Cup winner and host of the 2004 and 2009 NCAA Division II Cross Country National Championships.

In addition to his duties as director of Athletics, Hall also is the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's tennis committee. He has served on the Great Lakes Valley Conference Executive Committee and the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional women's basketball committee.

Hall joined the USI Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach.

As the men's tennis coach, no one did it better in the GLVC than Hall. He was named the GLVC Coach of the Year five times, directed the Screaming Eagles to four GLVC regular-season titles and GLVC Tournament crowns, and had a 123-47 record (.724).

During his final season as head coach, Hall led the Eagles to their third straight appearance in the NCAA II Tournament and their first victory

in the post-season. In 2000 and 2001, Hall put the Eagles on the national map with their first two invitations to the NCAA II Tournament in the 27-year history of the program.

Hall came to USI after his appointment at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fundraising and promotional activities.

The native of Murray, Kentucky, is a 1990 *cum laude* graduate of Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

In 1998-99, he completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program at the University of South Carolina and the University of Notre Dame.

Hall and his wife, Patti, reside in Evansville and have four sons, Nathan, Garland, Ty, and Owen, and daughter, Mary Claire.

## ...a modern, technology-enhanced environment

USI is a vibrant campus with modern facilities and an exciting pace of growth. The face of the campus has continued to change with an entrance roundabout, an addition to the Recreation, Fitness, and Wellness Center opening this year, and a Business and Engineering Center to open next fall. The University Center renovation will open in the spring of 2011. USI provides the most up-to-date facilities for academics, housing, and student life.



### Computer Services

### **Location**

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

### **The Campus**

The Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, Education Center, and Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, University Center, Liberal Arts Center, Technology Center, and Business and Engineering Center (now under construction) form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation, Fitness, and Wellness Center are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,800 students who live on campus.



### **Academic Life**

The University enrolls 10,516 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education, including a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

### **Campus Life**

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.

### **Residence Life**

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suite-style housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular to students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

### **Financial Assistance**

USI provides families with an affordable way to higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.

## Physical Activities Center

The Physical Activities Center (PAC) has been the home of the Screaming Eagles for the past 29 years. Opened in 1980, the PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, and is the arena for the USI basketball and volleyball teams.

The center court of the PAC has been the setting for many games of regional and national interest during the past 17 years. USI has hosted the 1993, 1994, and 1996 men's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; the 2009 men's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 women's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 and 2001 women's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; and the 2000 and 2004 GLVC Volleyball Tournaments.

A true home court, the USI men's basketball team has a 387-66 home record since 1980, a .854 winning percentage.

In 2006-07, the PAC underwent renovations that included three new wood courts and a new center-court design that incorporated USI's athletic logo. The renovation also featured a new scoreboard and video board, new portable goals, and new seating. Among the changes to the seating were padded chairback seats and back-supported bleacher seats.

## Eagles adapt to changes in 2009-10

The University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles enter every season with the same objective—win championships—but they will have to adapt to changes in 2009-10 to reach those goals.

The Eagles start 2009-10 with a new hand at helm in Head Coach **Rodney Watson**. Watson begins his first head coaching season after 21 seasons at Southern Illinois University. He has been the associate head coach the last two seasons after spending 19 seasons as an assistant coach under head coaches Rich Herrin, Bruce Weber, Matt Painter, and Chris Lowery.

During Watson's tenure at SIU, the Salukis won 11 Missouri Valley Conference championships and qualified for nine NCAA Tournaments and six NITs. SIU also compiled a 430-237 record, a .645 winning percentage, and was ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense four times in the last five seasons.

Watson's version of the Eagles, which includes eight returning players and three newcomers, features an attacking style on both ends of the court. He has an All-American in senior guard **Jamar Smith** to captain the team and run the show.

Smith, who leads a class of six seniors into the season, averaged 18.5 points and 3.9 three-point field goals made in 21 appearances in 2008-09. The first team All-GLVC performer had two games with seven three-point field goals made and eight contests with at least five long-range buckets, while scoring a season-best 29 points against Missouri University of Science and Technology and Drury University.

Senior guard **Marvin Gray** returns to give USI a solid one-two combination in the backcourt. Gray led the Eagles in assists with 4.2 per game, while dropping in 10.9 points per contest. He also was second on the team in steals with 1.7 per game.

In the frontcourt, USI returns a formidable senior foursome in **Tyrone Bradshaw**, **Brandon Carr**, **Jeron Lewis**, and **Isaac Stoll**.

Bradshaw came off the bench in all 34 games last year to lead the team and rank second in the GLVC with 76 blocks, while averaging 7.9 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. He had a season-best six blocks at Lewis University last December.

Carr, who will rejoin the team after the first semester, started all 34 games during his first season with the Eagles and led the team in rebounding with 5.3 per game, including a season-best 11 boards in the GLVC Tournament. He also dropped in 7.4 points per contest.

USI's big man in the middle, Lewis averaged 6.1 points and 3.7 rebounds per appearance while starting 19 of 34 games. He had the Eagles' top rebound game of 2008-09, grabbing 13 off the glass against Saint Joseph's College. Completing the conversion from baseball to basketball last season, Stoll could be a sleeper for the Eagles in the frontcourt. He saw action in all 34 games last season, averaging 1.7 points and 2.8 rebounds.

A strong cast of underclassmen returns to join the senior class.

Returning to play in the backcourt are junior **Kevin Gant** and sophomore **Brandon Hogg**. Gant played in all 34 games last year with his one start coming in the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional win over Rockhurst University. He averaged 3.6 points and was second on the squad with 1.7 assists per contest.

Hogg played in 29 of 34 games during his inaugural collegiate season, averaging 8.4 minutes and 2.8 points per appearance.

Starting his third season with the program, junior forward **Nick Duncheon** returns to join the frontcourt. Duncheon will look to bounce back in 2009-10 after his season was cut short after 14 games due to a broken jaw last year.

Watson added three players to his arsenal during the summer with junior guard **C.J. Trotter**, junior center **Mohamed Ntumba**, and freshman guard **Lawrence Thomas**.

Ntumba transfers to USI as a junior from Southeastern Illinois College where he was named first team All-Great Rivers Athletic Conference and All-Region 24 after averaging 13.1 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. The 6-foot-7 forward is a native of Kinshasa, The Congo (formerly Zaire), that also produced former Screaming Eagle Ilo Mutombo, who still ranks second all-time at USI in rebounding.

Trotter joins USI after two seasons at Rend Lake College where he earned second team All-Great Rivers Athletic Conference and

honorable mention All-Region 24 after averaging 13.6 points, 5.2 rebounds, and 2.4 assists per game as a sophomore.

The lone freshman on this year's squad, Thomas comes to USI after finishing his prep career as the Central State Eight Conference Male Athlete of the Year at Southeast High School. The Illinois Basketball Coaches Association (IBCA) second team All-State performer in 2009 led the CS8 in scoring this past year with 22.3 points per game on his way to being named the conference Player of the Year.

A major obstacle for the Eagles in 2009-10 comes with the GLVC and its expansion to 15 teams that are divided into three five-team divisions. USI is in the East Division along with traditional GLVC rivals Bellarmine University, University of Indianapolis, Northern Kentucky University, and Kentucky Wesleyan College. Four of the five teams in the East advanced to the NCAA II Tournament a year ago.

In addition to a tough home-and-home division schedule, USI plays the remainder of the GLVC teams once and has a non-conference schedule that includes Michigan Technical University and the University of Minnesota-Duluth.



Senior guard **Jamar Smith** earned honorable mention All-America honors last year after averaging a team-high 18.5 points in 21 games. Smith also is a preseason All-American heading into the 2009-10 campaign.

In addition to the national charities, the Department of Athletics sponsors Eagle Math, a nationally recognized program to encourage young students to improve their math skills. The program is designed around the Eagle Math booklets printed in first quarter, second quarter, third quarter, and fourth quarter sequence to carry out the sports theme.

As student athletes practice to get better, math students are encouraged to practice math to excel in the classroom.



## **Rodney Watson, Head Coach**

In May of 2009, **Rodney Watson** became the ninth head coach in the history of the Screaming Eagles.

Watson begins his first season at the helm of the Screaming Eagles after 21 seasons at Southern Illinois University. He has been the associate head coach the last two seasons after spending 19 seasons as an assistant coach under head coaches Rich Herrin, Bruce Weber, Matt Painter, and Chris Lowery.

During Watson's tenure at SIU, the Salukis have won 11 Missouri Valley Conference championships and qualified for nine NCAA Tournaments and six NITs. SIU also compiled a 430-237 record, a .645 winnings percentage, and was ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense four times in the last five seasons.

Watson helped direct five Salukis to Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Player of the Year honors; four to Newcomer of the Year awards; five to Freshman of the Year accolades; and nine to Defensive Player of the Year honors.

The Salukis had 30 players earn All-MVC honors (18 first team and 12 second) during Watson's 21 seasons.

The Salukis' success was not limited to the basketball court, with 23 of the last 24 seniors earning bachelor's degrees since 2002. SIU had the Prairie Farms Student Athlete of the Year for men's basketball three times since the award was created in 2002.

A native of Paris, Illinois, Watson started his coaching career at Coulterville High School, where he guided the Eagles to the program's first regional championship. He moved to Madison High School in 1984 and led the Trojans to a regional and sectional championship, advancing to the Illinois Elite Eight.

Success at the high school level was a springboard to the college ranks, beginning with a two-year stretch in 1986 at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. He moved to SIU in 1988, beginning his 20-plus season association with the Salukis.

Watson and his wife Carol have four children, Ashley, Zachary, and twins, Olivia and Blake.

## Brent Owen, Graduate Assistant Coach

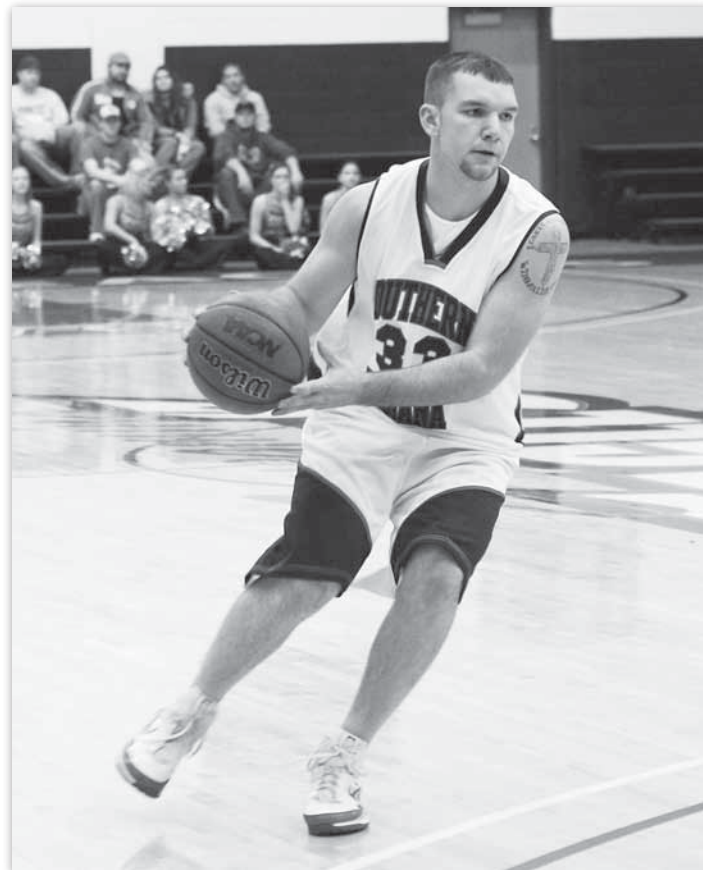


Brent Owen '09 makes the transition from player to coach in 2009-10, joining Head Coach Rodney Watson's staff as a graduate assistant.

# University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles ABOUT THE GREAT LAKES VALLEY CONFERENCE

The 15-member Great Lakes Valley Conference has made its name throughout the last 31 years as a power in NCAA Division II basketball. In the last few years, however, the GLVC has seen success in many sports, and the league can now claim itself as one of the nation's top in all NCAA Division II athletics.

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools - Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine and Indiana State University at Evansville (now the University of Southern Indiana) - began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, the University of Indianapolis and Saint Joseph's College expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those schools - along with Ashland University - united to become the GLVC.

In 2009, Maryville University and the University of Illinois at Springfield became the newest members of the league. The schools are two of 13 institutions that have joined the league since its formation. Those members include: Lewis University (1980), Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne (1984), Northern Kentucky University (1985), Kentucky State University (1989), Quincy University (1994), Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (1994), University of Wisconsin-Parkside (1994), University of Missouri-St. Louis (1995), Drury (2005), Missouri S&T (2005), Rockhurst (2005), Illinois-Springfield (2009) and Maryville (2009). Ashland and Kentucky State left the conference after the 1994 season, IPFW left the league following the 2000-01 academic year and SIU Edwardsville exited the league following the 2007-08 academic year.

The conference headquarters are located in downtown Indianapolis, one of the many Midwest major media markets in which the league maintains a presence. The GLVC has schools in Milwaukee/Northern Illinois (UW-Parkside), Chicago (Lewis), Indianapolis (Indianapolis), Cincinnati (Northern Kentucky), Louisville (Bellarmine), Evansville (Southern Indiana), Springfield, Mo. (Drury), Owensboro (Kentucky Wesleyan), Kansas City (Rockhurst) and St. Louis (Maryville, UM-St. Louis).

The conference sponsors 17 championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, indoor and outdoor track and field, and tennis for men and basketball, cross country, softball, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, golf, and volleyball for women.

GLVC institutions have won 11 national championships in basketball. Kentucky Wesleyan leads all Division II institutions with eight men's basketball titles, while Southern Indiana won the men's crown in 1995. Northern Kentucky's women won the school's first-ever basketball national championship in 2000 and followed with a national title in 2008. In addition, SIU Edwardsville became the first GLVC school to win a national championship in softball in 2007.

In 2001, the league announced the creation of the GLVC Hall of Fame, with the first class being inducted in 2002. The GLVC annually presents the Richard F. Scharf Paragon Award to the top male and female student-athlete in the league, and the Bertram Award to a distinguished alum who both succeeded while a GLVC student-athlete and excelled in accomplishments after graduation.

The GLVC strives to adhere to the NCAA Division II Strategic Platform and has introduced several initiatives in recent years including the GLVC Sportsmanship Award which acknowledges the institution that exemplifies sportsmanship in the view of its peers.

The league continually maintains an effort to combine academic and athletic excellence and the hard work put forth by the student-athletes has been evident on the playing fields and in the classrooms.

**D**uring the last 30 years, the University of Southern Indiana men's basketball program has become a force in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, the Great Lakes Region, and at the national level.

Since the beginning of the GLVC in 1978, the Screaming Eagles have become one of the premier teams in the league, winning 13 regular-season titles in the GLVC. USI's teams also have featured four GLVC Coaches of the Year and six conference Players of the Year.



Starting with the 1992-93 team, the Eagles have made their mark on the Great Lakes Region and the NCAA Division II. USI has won 20 or more games 16 times in the last 17 years and averaged more than 25 victories a year since 1992-93.

The Eagles stepped into the national spotlight in 1993-94 when they made their first trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight and the NCAA Division II Championship game.

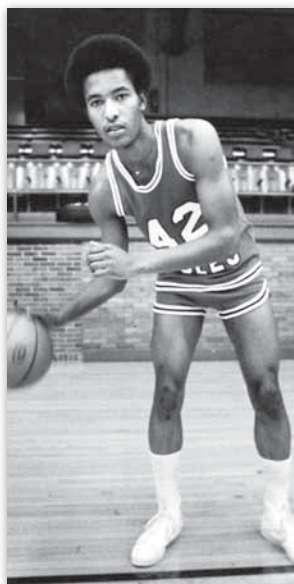
The loss in the 1994 championship game propelled USI back into the NCAA Division II Championship game in 1995, and on to its first-ever national championship.



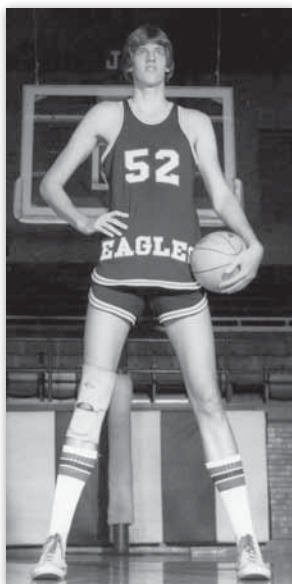
USI has been ranked number one nationally at one point during the season in eight of the last 15 years and has been to the NCAA Division II Sweet 16 nine times in the last 17 years.

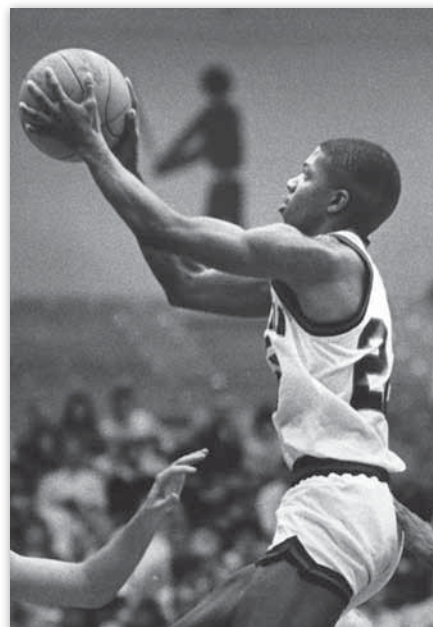

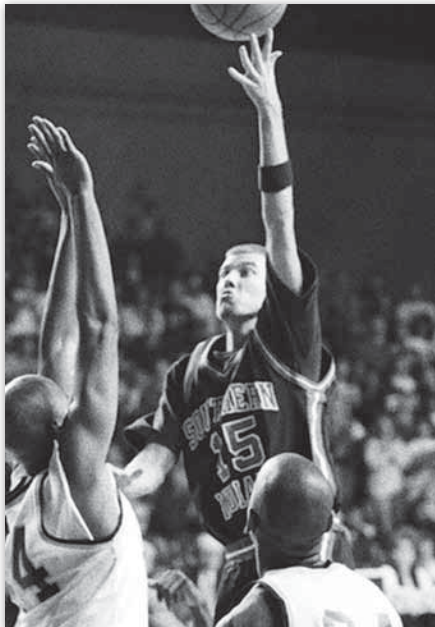
