HOMECOMING REMINDER. ISUE Homecoming Week will culminate Saturday, February 25 with a full day of activities, beginning with the old-timers game between former ISUE basketball players at 3:00 p.m. in the PAC. A reception for the old-timers will follow the game in the Eagles Nest. At 5:00 p.m., ISUE'S Lady Eagles meet the Lewis women, and at 7:30 p.m., the ISUE men's team plays the Lewis men. At half time of the men's game, the Homecoming Court will be presented and the King and Queen will be announced.

Following the game, the Alumni Association will host a reception for alumni, faculty and staff at the University Home from 9:30 to 11:30 p.m.

The Homecoming Dance, sponsored by APB, will be in the UC Dining Room after the game.

THE MAKING OF A FINE ART BOOK. Two ISUE faculty members are participating in five public programs on "The Making of a Fine Art Book," sponsored by Evansville-Vanderburgh Public Libraries.

The Oaklyn Branch Library will host "Writing This Book," a presentation by Robert McDowell, assistant professor of English, on March 1. On March 5, Michael Aakhus, assistant professor of art, will present "Illustrating This Book," at McCollough Branch Library. The three remaining programs will be March 11 at Meadow Park Branch, March 21 at West Branch, and March 28 at Central Library. HUMANITIES FORUM. The Humanities Forum is sponsoring a poetry reading by Ralph Burns February 29 at 1:00 p.m. in the University Center. A recent recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts grant in poetry, Mr. Burns resides in Bloomington and works as a writer-in-residence at Madison State Hospital. His poetry has appeared in a number of exemplary magazines, including Poetry, Field, Kayak, and Southern Poetry Review. His first collection, US, was published in 1983 by Cleveland State University Press and is available in the ISUE Bookstore.

The poet John Woods said "Ralph Burns has found a poetry of clarity, the clarity of running water, where you can see through to the things of this world, shining and changing."

Admission is free and open to the public.

WOMEN'S HISTORY CELEBRATION. The Women's History Celebration, sponsored by ISUE and several community organizations, will be March 4 through March 10. During the week, seminars and meetings will develop four themes - women in politics, women in religion, women and wellness, and women in the arts. At noon Saturday, March 10, Judith Clabes, editor of The Kentucky Post who edited the recently-published book New Guardians of the Press, Selected Profiles of America's Women Newspaper Editors, will give the keynote address for the Celebration. An autograph party will precede the luncheon speech. Brochures detailing the entire week's activities are available in the President's Office and in the Office of Sports Medicine and Student Health.

ALL CAMPUS STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS. Awards will be presented at the Honors Day ceremony to clubs, organizations and individuals. The ISUE All Campus Student Achievement Award will be given to one male and one female student having completed 24 hours of work at ISUE and having at least a 2.5 GPA. Selection will be based on academic achievement, service to the University, and participation in extracurricular activities during the 1983-84 academic year. Honors Day has been set for Thursday, April 19 at 9:30 a.m. in the Physical Activities Center.

Eligible students are encouraged to fill out an application for the award, which may be obtained at the Student Activities Office, and returned there by 4:30 p.m. March 9. The applications will be screened by the Student Activities Committee made up of students, administration and faculty.
