CREDIT UNION AVAILABLE TO EMPLOYEES

The Indiana State University Credit Union offers full-time university employees a savings and loan program. Members of an employee's family may also join the Credit Union.

The Credit Union offers signature loans on 10% of the base salary with 12% annual rates; car loans up to 80% of cost on a new car and according to red book value on a used car; and loans on new appliances and new furniture with 12% rates. Life insurance is offered on the loan up to the loan value. Thirty-six months are maximum allowed to pay back a loan.

Savings through the Credit Union are insured up to \$20,000 per account. Life insurance is offered on savings up to \$2,000. Savings have 5-3/4% dividend.

Membership applications for ISU Credit Union are available to ISUE Personnel through the ISUE Personnel Office. A 25¢ fee is charged to open an account. Currently 33% of the ISUE employees participate in the Credit Union.

The Credit Union operates through payroll deductions. Located on the Terre Haute campus, the Credit Union is managed by Mrs. Loeva Piepenbrink. Further information about the Credit Union is available from ISUE Personnel Office, extension 270.

PROGRAM ON JUVENILE JUSTICE TO BE HELD ON CAMPUS

The problems of juvenile corrections and the adequacies and inadequacies of the Indiana system of juvenile corrections will be discussed in two programs at ISUE. The programs, "Juvenile Justice: Children in Trouble in Indiana" will be shown throughout Indiana via the facilities of the Indiana Higher Education Telecommunications System (IHETS). A film, "Children in Trouble," based on the Howard James book, "Children in Trouble: A National Scandal," will introduce the subject matter.

The ISUE presentations are scheduled for September 26 and October 3 beginning at 11:00 a.m. in Room 126. Local law enforcement agents and representatives of ISUE and University of Evansville will appear on the panel discussions. The public is invited to attend.
