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USI REGISTRATION, ORIENTATION SLATED. Fall Semester classes will begin Monday, August 28, with registration and orientation programs scheduled the preceding week. The Fall Faculty and Administrative Staff meeting will be held at 8:30 a.m. Monday, August 21, in the UC Dining Room. The School of Liberal Arts faculty will meet at 1:30 p.m. in Forum III; School of Nursing and Health Professions faculty will meet at 1:30 p.m. in L100; and various School of Business faculty meetings will get under way at 2:30 p.m. in SC154. New faculty orientation will be held at 8 a.m. Tuesday, August 22, in UC350. The Medical Education orientation program will be at 8 a.m. Monday, August 28, in UC350.

Orientation for new students' families will begin at 1 p.m. Sunday, August 20, in the Physical Activities Center; Campus Ministry will offer a freshman orientation mass at 10:30 a.m. in UC350. New student orientation gets under way at 8 a.m. Monday, August 21, in the PAC. Placement testing is slated at various times throughout the week. New student registration will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Wednesday, August 23, and open registration will be from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday, August 24. Orientation programs for older (age 25 and older) students or those who will attend night classes will be held from 1 to 3 p.m. and 6 to 9 p.m. Monday, August 21, in Forum II. A Study Skills Course for Older Students will be offered at 6 p.m. Wednesday, August 23. For information, contact the Admissions Office, extension 1765.

Special student events will include a Clubs and Organizations Fair from 12 noon to 3 p.m. Monday, August 21, on the UC Mall; Panhellenic Rush Week activities starting that day in the University Center; the Activities Programming Board's orientation dance from 6 p.m. to 1 a.m. Friday, August 25, featuring the band, Jady Kurrent; Interfraternity Council's rush kick-off dance from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. on Monday, August 28, on the UC Mall; an orientation meeting for students who will live in MASH and Campus Apartments student housing at 5 p.m. Tuesday, August 29, in PAC122A; and an APB lounge act, **comedian Randy Levin**, at 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Thursday, August 31, in the Eagle's Nest.

USI'S OFF-CAMPUS SITES, CLASSES EXPANDING. There is an expanding opportunity for students to attend USI classes at sites closer to home this fall. Morning and evening classes are scheduled at USI's Pollack Avenue Center (Nativity School, 3635 Pollack); afternoon and evening classes are offered at Ivy Tech-Southwest, 3501 First Avenue; and evening classes will be held at Castle High School north of Newburgh, South Spencer High School at Reo, Ivy Tech-Tell City, and Vincennes University-Jasper Center. A variety of courses will be available at Castle, Ivy Tech-Southwest, and the Pollack Center, with selected courses being offered at the other sites. Most are regular undergraduate credit courses applicable to USI degree programs and have a fee of \$53.50 per credit hour for Indiana residents. Those planning to enroll in courses

offered only at the Pollack Center and Castle are urged to attend a special registration session from 6 to 7 p.m. Tuesday, August 22, at the Pollack Center.
