JERRY BAUM TO TEACH WATERCOLOR AT ISUE.
Jerry Baum is well-known throughout

the Tri-State area both as an artist and as a teacher. This summer he will bring his talents to the ISUE campus in three noncredit courses on watercolor techniques. Each course will include demonstrations by Mr. Baum and will conclude with a critique of students' work. Outdoor painting experiences will be included in each eight-week course.

Beginning Watercolor will give participants an introduction to the concepts of drawing, composition, painting techniques, and their adaptation to the transparent medium of watercolor. This course is designed to encourage creativity in the beginning painter, and it will meet for eight Tuesdays, from June 9 through July 28, from 6:30 - 10:00 p.m.

Intermediate Watercolor is designed for the student who has mastered the basic elements of watercolor and wishes to enhance technique. Students should be familiar with basic drawing, composition, and design. This course meets from June 11 through July 30, from 6:30 - 10:00 p.m.

Seeing Watercolor Work - Master Class is for anyone interested in watercolor. The class meets from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. for eight Saturdays, June 13 through August 1. Each Saturday a guest artist will share experiences, techniques, methods, and approaches to watercolor through discussion and critiques of individual works. The Master Class centers on the creative building of a painting.
