Dr. Emmett Edwards, acting dean of the University of Southern Indiana School of Business, has added three faculty members for the fall 1990 semester. They are David Davis, visiting lecturer; John Clark Killough, instructor in business administration; and Robert D. Wuerth, visiting instructor.

Davis has a Master of Accountancy from Southern Illinois University, Carbondale, where he has been manager of the Self-Employment Training Program and counselor in the Small Business Development Center. Davis also has been owner-operator of an electronic manufacturing firm producing products for the model airplane industry worldwide.

Killough earned a B.A. in 1973 and a J.D. in 1976 from the University of South Carolina. After law school, he served as a VISTA lawyer on a prisoners' rights project in Raleigh, North Carolina. He later opened a law office in Charlotte and worked as a staff attorney on an anti-poverty project in rural eastern North Carolina. Killough also earned an M.B.A. from East Carolina University in 1984 and is working on his dissertation for a Ph.D. at USC.

Wuerth received his Master of Accountancy from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana and is a certified public accountant. His business career includes 11 years with McDonald's Corporation, where he served in various capacities including assistant controller. Wuerth also has worked for Pepsico restaurant division in Detroit and as staff auditor for Arthur Young & Company in Chicago.
