The USI Alumni Association is offering a plate with the University logo and colors under a program initiated by the Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles, and must have an initial order of 200 plates by August 1 to qualify.

Application forms are available in the Alumni Affairs Office. USI alumni, staff, students, and friends may reserve plates through November 1 by making a \$25 tax-deductible restricted contribution (per plate) to the USI Alumni Scholarship Endowment. Certified applications will be returned to applicants by December 1 and should be presented with registration forms in acquiring plates, which will be available in license branch offices after January 1. A \$10 processing fee will be added to normal registration fees and taxes. Plate numbers will be assigned randomly; special requests CANNOT be honored. NAMES IN THE NEWS. Dr. Charles T. Barber, chair of the Philosophy and Political Science Department, represented Indiana at the State Directors Meeting of the National Council on U.S.-Arab Relations (NCUSAR), held May 13 in Washington, D.C. He was among 15 participants chosen for a NCUSAR study tour May 14-28 of Syria and Kuwait, where he met with Kuwaiti education officials and saw evidence of destruction and pillaging in the 1990-91 Iraqi invasion. In Syria, he met with government, religious, and educational officials and visited Quneitra, which still shows evidence of Israeli destruction after the seizure of the Golan Heights.

The Board of Directors of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) has selected Mr. Augustine J. Fredrich, chair of the Engineering Technology Department, as one of four initial recipients of the Citizen Engineer Award. ASCE created the award to recognize members for contributions as volunteers in the communities where they live and work. Mr. Fredrich was nominated for the award by the Society's Committee on Public Involvement in recognition of his work with youth and high school soccer programs in Evansville and throughout Indiana, for his contributions as a catechist and lector in his parish and as a member of the USI Campus Ministry Board, for his work on the Allocations Committee of the United Way of Southwestern Indiana, for his service on the Environmental Advisory Board for the Evansville Environmental Protection Agency, and for his efforts to interest young people in careers in science and engineering.

Ms. Aimee J. Luebben, Occupational Therapy Program director, was recognized by the Belleville Public Library and Mayor Brauer for nine years of service on the Board of Trustees, including two as president. She represented Belleville on the Kaskaskia Library System Board of Directors; served as president for three years; chaired the Presidents of Illinois Library Systems, a group that represents the governing bodies of all Illinois libraries; and was appointed by Governor James Edgar as a delegate to the Illinois White House Conference on Libraries.

Dr. Daniel C. Scavone, professor of history, has two entries -- "The Ku Klux Klan in the 1920s" and "The Locarno Conference of 1925" -- included in *Great Events in Civil Rights History*, edited by F. N. Magill and forthcoming from Salem Press. Dr. Scavone has been invited by Salem Press to write three entries in the series *Great Events from History: Arts and Culture*. His topics will be "Das Cabinet des Dr. Caligari and German Expressionist Film," "Luis Bunuel and Salvador Dali and Surrealism," and "The Inspiration for Henry Moore's Shapes."
