ANOTHER RECORD ENROLLMENT AT ISUE. This fall's enrollment was a record 3586 compared to last year's 3251, an increase of 10.3%. This year's enrollment figure includes 140 students in the Deaconess School of Nursing program; 84 of whom have not taken classes at ISUE before. These students accounted for about a 3% increase. Enrollment figures by class are shown below.

GRANT FOR MICROCOMPUTERS AND WORD PROCESSING EQUIPMENT. Grant proposals prepared by Mr. Ghazi Alkhatib and Dr. Larry Arp have resulted in a \$21,587 grant approved by the State Board of Vocational and Technical Education (SBVTE) for the purchase of microcomputers and word processing equipment to be utilized in courses offered by the Division of Business. Division chairman Dr. Kenneth Settle stated that the associate degree programs in data processing technology and secretarial administration meet the requirements of SBVTE for vocational grants for instructional equipment.

Since 1978 three grants totalling \$62,950 have been awarded to these associate degree programs. Dr. Arp and Dr. Settle have served as chairpersons and team members on accreditation committees for programs funded by the SBVTE.
