Love and kisses highlight APB Homecoming agenda

William Cane, an English teacher at Boston College who has lectured at universities and colleges on the subject of kissing since 1991, will visit the USI campus on Sunday, February 9, launching the Activities Programming Board (APB) week-long Homecoming festivities on the theme "Love is in the Air." The program at 8 p.m. in Mitchell Auditorium is free and open to the public.

Cane's multimedia presentation — he uses music, slides, videotapes, and live student demonstrations — helps students learn how to get over first-kiss jitters. Topics include the psychology of kissing, how to avoid kissing diseases, and methods of making yourself more kissable in the eyes of the opposite sex. Cane also will offer advice on where men and women like to be kissed, based on the first Internet kissing survey in history; he also will cover bizarre kissing customs from around the world, the newest fads in Fench kissing, and point-by-point instructions for today's trendiest kisses.

Cane grew up in New York City. He received a law degree from Boston College Law School and practiced briefly in 1986, then turned to teaching; he received an M.A. in English from Boston University. His books, *The Art of Kissing* and *The Book of Kisses*, have been translated into 19 foreign languages and he has appeared on more than 100 local and national radio and television programs. His research has been featured in print and electronic media internationally. His report on a majob new study on hugging was due out in 1996.
