Martin Luther King Day, Black History Month observance:

No classes will be held on Monday, January 16, in the University's Martin Luther King Day observance which will feature **Mr. Randall Robinson**, the TransAfrica director who went on a 27-day fast in protest of the Clinton Administration's Haitian policy. He will speak at 7 p.m. Tuesday, January 17, in Mitchell Auditorium of the new Health Professions Center.

Mr. Robinson is considered by many to be the American most responsible for democratic elections in South Africa, starting 10 years ago when protest activity at the South African Embassy landed him in jail and sparked a Congressional Black Caucus campaign that grew into a nationwide movement to boycott South Africa.

His appearance here is sponsored by the USI Multicultural Center, Black Student Union, Activities Programming Board, and USI Foundation, with support from the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation. For information, contact **Mrs. Pamela Hopson**, Multicultural Center director, extension 7188.
