ARE OBJECTS FROM CHINA ON ISUE HICAGO ART AND THEATRE TOUR. "The Great Bronze Age of China," a major exhibition from the People's Republic of China, is one of the optional activities of ISUE's Chicago Art and Theatre tour. Rare bronze, jade and terra cotta objects dating from 1500 B.C. to 210 B.C. and only recently excavated will be on display at the Field Museum of Natural History.

Another highlight of the trip is the Tony Award-winning play "The Elephant Man" based on the actual case of a freak named John Merrick who had an enormous head and bone deformities. The actor portraying Merrick suggests the ugliness of the person without make-up but by contorting his body in various ways.

Other activities available are a visit to the Museum of Science and Industry or the Shedd Aquarium, shopping in the Loop or at Water Tower Place, and dining in fine restaurants. DR. JAMES BLEVINS, chairman of the division of humanities, and SYLVIA WEINZAPFEL, assistant director of continuing education, are the tour coordinators.

The tour will leave ISUE at 8:30 a.m. on Friday, August 22 and return at approximately 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 24. Deadline for registration is August 6. The \$99.00 registration fee includes bus fare, box lunch, two nights lodging at the Palmer House (double occupancy), theatre ticket and transportation to the optional activities.
