WSWI TO BEGIN BROADCASTING NOVEMBER 2. On Monday, November 2, 1981, WSWI Radio - AM 82, will go "on the air" from its new studios in the ISUE Technology Center. ISUE faculty and staff are invited to an Open House at WSWI from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m., Monday, November 2. Employees should check with their supervisors about appropriate times to attend the Open House.

WSWI is licensed as a non-commercial educational radio service of ISUE and will operate on a frequency of 820 kHz with a power output of 250 watts. WSWI will broadcast cultural, educational, and informational programs, and its musical format includes the classics and jazz. This radio service of ISUE has been made possible by the donation of WIKY-AM by John David Engelbrecht to ISUE.

Currently, the station is being supported by the ISUE Foundation and the ISUE Alumni Association. Additional support for WSWI will be sought through the underwriting of programs and through gifts to the "Friends of WSWI" in the Foundation Office. University employees and other interested persons may become members of "Friends of WSWI" and therefore help to continue the high quality of programming which WSWI will provide. The station is being staffed by ISUE faculty and students. Persons wishing to volunteer to assist with the station should contact Dr. Kenneth Creech, extension 1950.

HALLOWEEN MADNESS. The Student Union Board will again sponsor Halloween Madness on Saturday, October 31, from 6:30 p.m. to 3:00 a.m. In addition to the traditional events such as hayrides, a costume contest, movies, and fortune-tellers, a new event has been added this year. A nationally-known hypnotist, Tom Deluca, will be featured starting at 9:00 p.m.

DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENT TICKETS FOR MEN'S BASKETBALL GAMES.

1. Tickets for men's basketball games may be picked up by students starting one week prior to the game, and until 4:30 p.m. the day before the game at the Student Activities area in the University Center.
2. Tickets can be picked up until 4:30 p.m. on game day in the athletic office located on the third floor of the HPER Building.
3. Students must pick up their own tickets and there will be only one ticket distributed per student ID. The tickets are non-transferable. Those entering the gate using a student ticket should bring their ID's to show to ticket takers.
4. Tickets for games played during a student vacation may be picked up by students prior to the vacation.
5. Married couples who have one student ticket and one regularly purchased ticket may sit together in the designated student section.

Due to the recent change in the University carrier of major medical-dental insurance from Equitable to Blue Cross/Blue Shield, new identification cards have been issued for all participants. FORMER ASTRONAUT TO GIVE 1981 MALCOLM KOCH LECTURE. Dr. Brian O'Leary, internationally-known scientist and former astronaut, will be the featured speaker for the admission-free 1981 Malcolm Koch lecture to be held on Wednesday, November 4 at 7:30 p.m. in A126. In his lecture "Exploring New Worlds and Living in Outer Space", Dr. O'Leary will explain the role of post-Apollo space exploration in establishing space colonies and high orbital manufacturing facilities. His slide-illustrated talk projects the concept that already available technology can provide earth with unlimited energy and resources by the 21st century.

PEOPLE IN THE NEWS. Dr. Robert E. Mays, director of field experiences and coordinator of graduate studies, was recently selected to chair the five-state Kappa Alpha Psi North Central Province Scholarship and Awards Committee. The committee will be responsible for making awards in Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.

Dr. Donald E. Pitzer, professor of history, directed the eighth annual Historic Communal Societies Conference at the Ephrata Cloister, Ephrata, Pennsylvania, on October 15 - 17. The ISUE Center for Communal Studies was a co-sponsor of this national meeting which attracted nearly 250 people representing 19 historic and four current communal societies. With a \$13,280 grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities and cost-sharing funds from ISUE and Indiana University, the conference featured the performance and analysis of the communal music of the Harmony Society, Shakers, Moravians, and Ephrata Cloister Baptists. The addresses will be printed in the 1982 Communal Societies: The Journal of the National Historic Communal Societies Association, and the music will be issued in a special recording. The 1982 conference will be October 14 - 16 at the Shaker Village in South Union, Kentucky, and the tenth annual conference will be at New Harmony.
