**SCULPTOR IN RESIDENCE.** ISUE has received a grant of \$3600.00 providing the campus with a Sculptor-in-Residence during the spring semester of 1979.

When? The project is funded in part by the Indiana Arts Commission and International Steel and will enable the artist to construct and install a large metal sculpture on campus in addition to building a smaller indoor work of art. The artist will be provided with materials to construct the sculpture along with the use of space, equipment and the help of professional metal workers at International Steel. The smaller art work will be fabricated on the campus.

As part of the project, the artist will teach a course on campus, conduct workshops, and lecture to local high schools and interested community groups.

Applications for the Sculptor-in-Residence position are being received by Dr. James Blevins, Chairman of the Division of Humanities.
