LOCAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL TO RECEIVE
DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FROM USI
SCHOOL OF NURSING AND HEALTH PROFESSIONS

Todd Kranpitz, director of Imaging Service at St. Mary's Medical Center, will receive the Distinguished Service Award from the University of Southern Indiana's School of Nursing and Health Professions during the School's Honors Day Program on March 27 in Forum I at 4 p.m. at USI.

The Distinguished Service Award recognizes outstanding service to the School. The first recipient of the honor, Kranpitz has been instrumental in helping obtain important equipment for the program including a radiologic film processor, an ultrasound test instrument, a C-arm fluoroscope, and an X-ray machine and ultrasound machine. "Mr. Kranpitz has helped us secure equipment, establish student scholarships, and recruit students. He has been so supportive of the program. He listened to the needs of the program and improved upon it," said Curt Serbus, program director and assistant professor of radiologic technology.

Dr. Nadine Coudret, dean of the School of Nursing and Health Professions, applauds Mr. Kranpitz's contributions to the School of Nursing and Health Professions saying, "It is appropriate that this first recipient be someone who not only lends his personal talents to the development of the program, but also involves himself in resource development.
