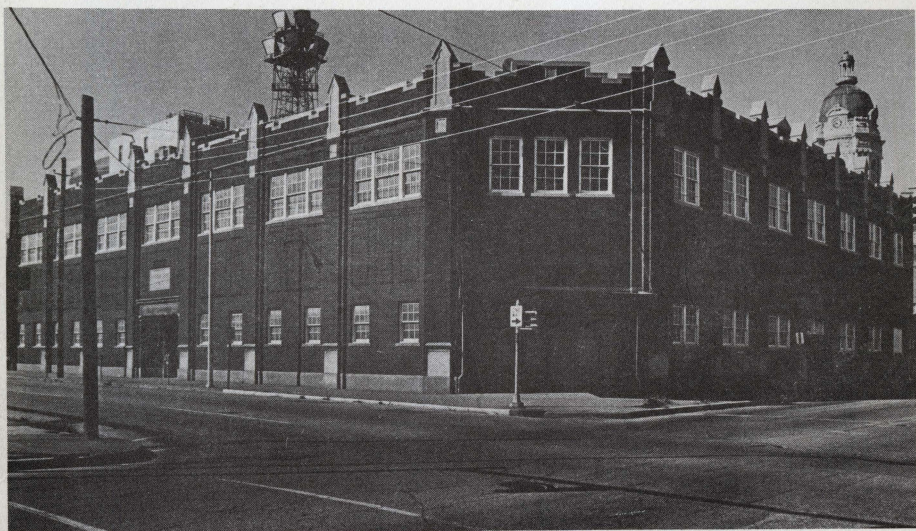

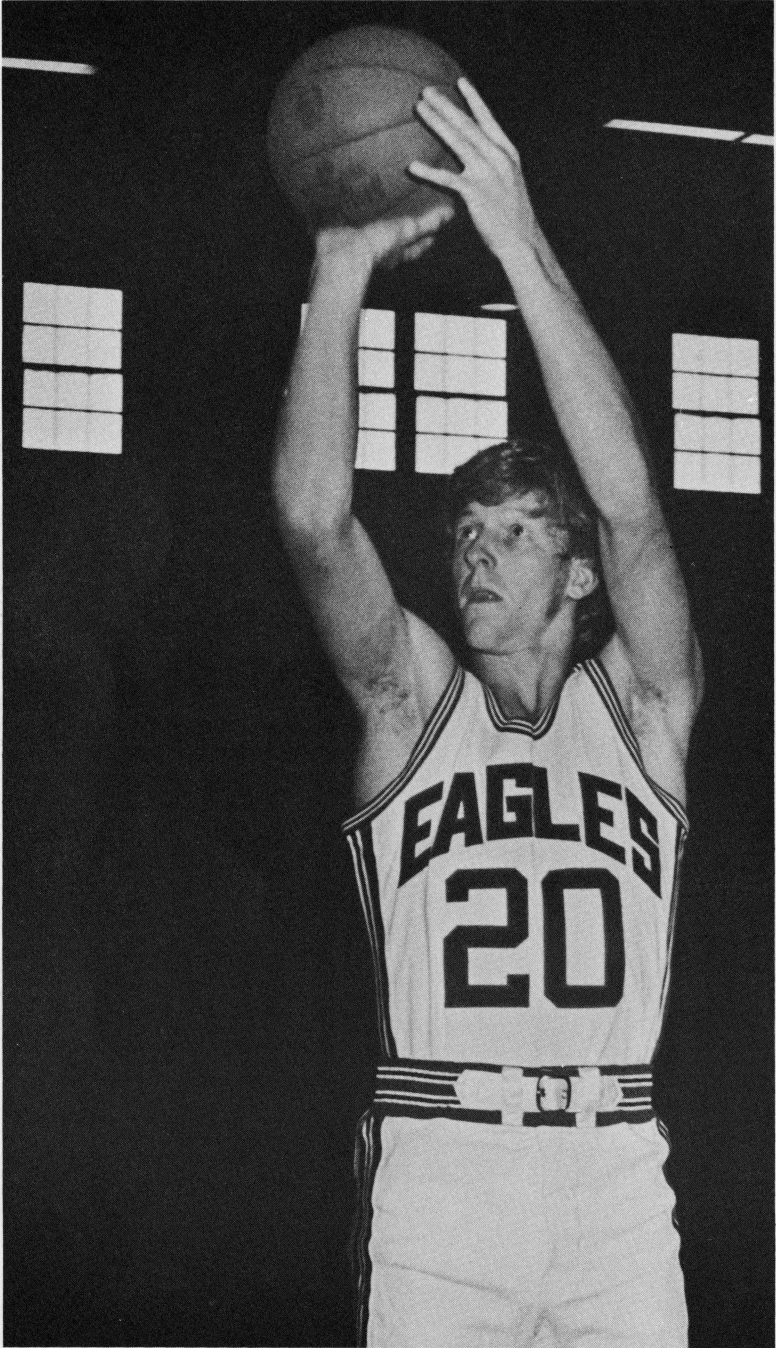

# INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY EVANSVILLE

Indiana State University Evansville is located on a 300-acre site in the Mid-America University Center midway between the metropolitan areas of Evansville, Indiana and Mt. Vernon, Indiana. Founded in 1965, the campus moved to its present site in 1969.

Current facilities, including a Classroom Science Center and Administrative Wing, University Library, and University Center, are being utilized by a 2600 member student body. A Classroom Applied Science Technology building is under construction and will be completed by 1975.

The institution is accredited by the North Central Association, the Indiana State Department of Public Instruction, the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education, and the Council on Dental Education of the American Dental Association.

Curricular opportunities are offered in 23 major areas and 30 minor areas in four-year baccalaureate degree programs, two-year associate degree programs and one-year certificate programs.

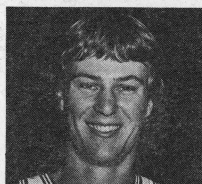
**Birkenfield, Joe** — Leading scorer for Castle High last year; good outside shooter; a great hustler; has quickness to contribute to pressing defense and fast break.



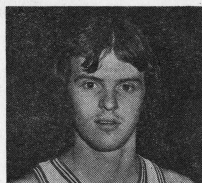
**Brothers, Ernie** — Last season's leading scorer; an outstanding perimeter shooter, experience should make him more improved this season.



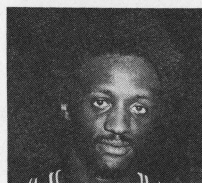
**Chase, Fred** — Holds school record for points in a single game (41); good scorer who has three seasons of varsity experience; needs to be more aggressive, increasing strength.



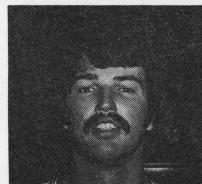
**Crisp, Jim** — Three year varsity letterman; has nice touch around basket; will need to improve rebounding to keep center position.



**Davidson, George** — A fine shooter who needs only consistency to be a fine starter; is recovering from broken leg incurred during summer; has experience to contribute.

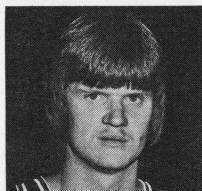

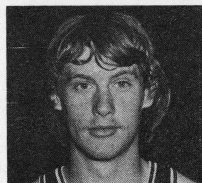

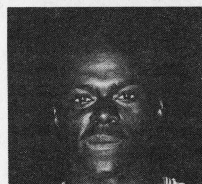
**Knight, David** — Had a fine high school career at Castle; possesses fine shooting touch; good mobility; needs to improve strength to battle the front lines in college competition.



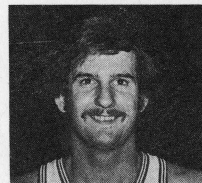
**Osterman, Mark** — An All-City performer from Evansville Mater Dei; has a good inside game; strong player who needs only college experience to become a varsity performer.



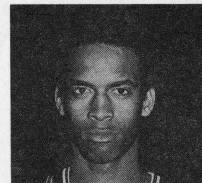

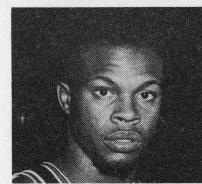
**Schickel, Ralph** — Possesses tremendous desire and hustle; is a rugged performer who strives on the physical game; tough around basket.



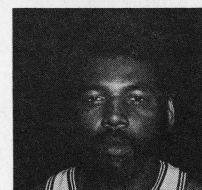
**Taylor, Eric** — Good shooter who needs only experience to become a top college forward; must become more aggressive and stronger.

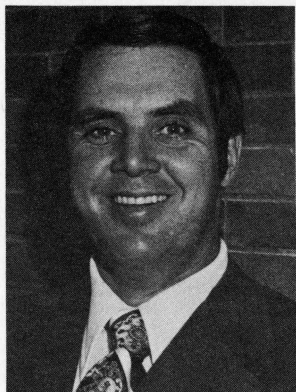

**Basketball Coach**

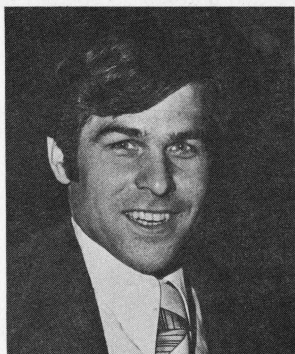
Wayne Boultinghouse begins his first year as Athletic Director and Basketball Coach for the ISUE Eagles and brings with him extensive experience both as a player and as a coach.

As a participant, Wayne was outstanding in high school, college and professional ranks. In high school, he lettered in basketball, baseball, football and track for four years. His college athletic experience included being named the conference Most Valuable Player in baseball in 1964. In basketball, Wayne played all four years on the team. They were conference champions in 1963 and 1964. The team, also in 1964, was the Divisional champions. Wayne was a NCAA participant in 1963 and recipient of the Kiwanis Award in 1964.

After his college career, Wayne signed with the St. Louis Cardinal organization and played at Sarasota, Florida. He played in the Mid-West league at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in 1965, 1966, and again in 1968, after serving two years in the Army.

Coach Boultinghouse brings five years of college coaching experience with him to the ISUE campus. He served on the University of Evansville staff as Ass't Athletic Director, Ass't. Basketball Coach and Baseball Coach. During his time on the basketball staff, the Aces compiled an 89-49 record. He is one of the few coaches who has played and coached an NCAA basketball championship team.

There is plenty of optimism being generated in the Eagle camp this year. Much of the credit is due to the enthusiasm Coach Boultinghouse has brought to the program. He readily admits that he loves the sport of basketball and sees it as a great vehicle for helping young people succeed. Wayne firmly believes that success is directly correlated to the amount of organization, dedication and work put forth by the coach and his staff. Coach Boultinghouse is eagerly looking forward to the challenges confronting him in building a successful basketball program.



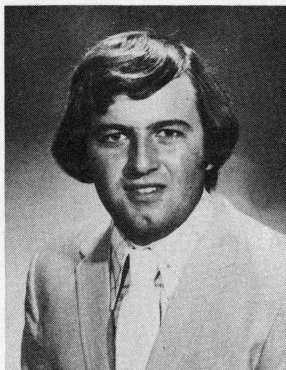
**Don Ramsden**

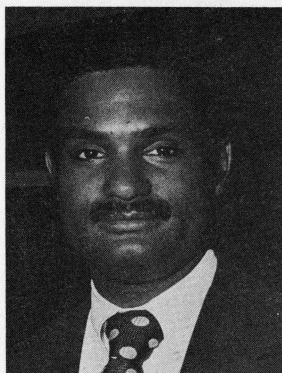
**Jack Marr**

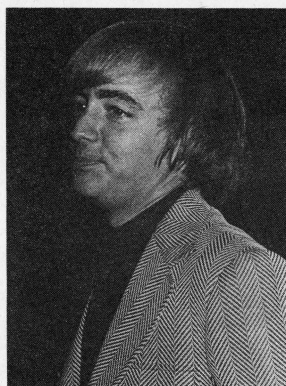
**Jim Hamilton**

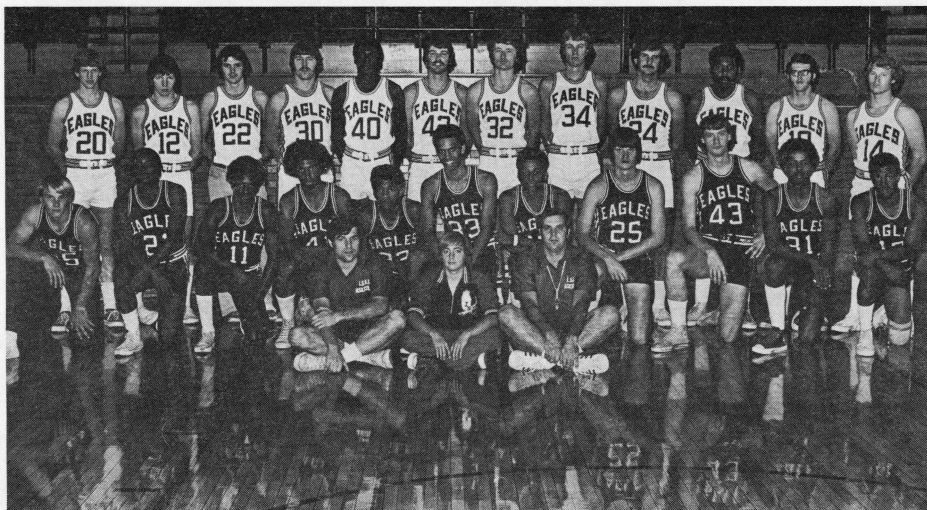

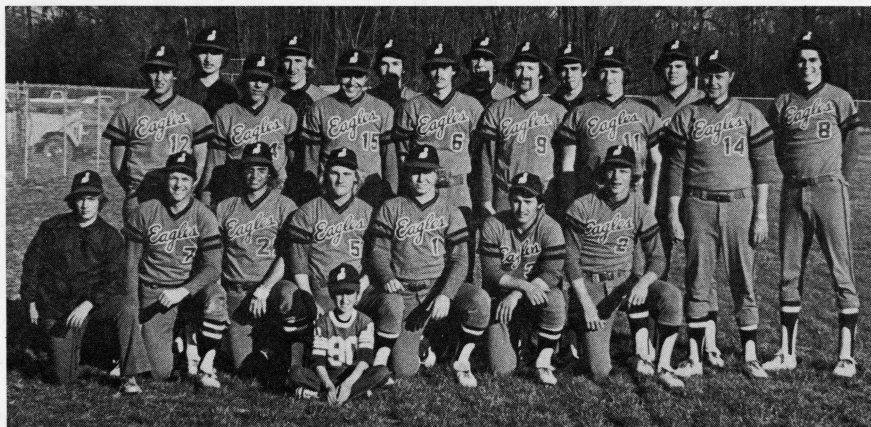

# BASEBALL OUTLOOK FOR 1975

The ISUE baseball team under Coach Jim Brown will inaugurate their fifth season on March 25 at Indiana Central. The baseball Eagles will be playing a 40 game schedule during the 1975 spring season which according to Coach Brown is the toughest schedule that any of his teams have faced. The baseball team will be playing its second season on their field located on the ISUE campus.

The squad will be a young squad with only four seniors and three juniors on the roster this spring. The first and second year men will need to produce if the team is to improve on the 1974 regular season record of 17-17 and receive a second consecutive NAIA District 21 tournament bid.

The key to the 1975 Eagle baseball team should be a well balanced team. "We are not exceptionally weak in any area. Hopefully, our defense will carry us," states Coach Brown. Our depth in pitching is a question mark but we have three excellent starters and a good relief specialist. Our other three pitchers will need to come through consistantly if we are to hold up for our rugged 40 game schedule. "Offensively, we won't score a lot of runs, but we won't be shut out either," concluded Coach Brown.

Barring injuries and steady improvement by the younger underclassmen, the 1975 baseball Eagles will improve on their 1974 season mark and have a winning season for the first time since their inaugural season in 1971.
