**1983 COMMENCEMENT.** More than 450 students will be awarded associate and baccalaureate degrees in Commencement ceremonies at ISUE on Saturday, May 7. Graduates are expected to arrive no later than 8:00 a.m. and are to report to the gymnastics court, Room 200, on the second floor of the Physical Activities Center. The platform party will robe in Rooms 202 and 203 at 8:00 a.m. also. Faculty members and administrative personnel will assemble in Rooms 207 and 208 at the south end of the Physical Activities Center no later than 8:30 a.m. The academic procession will begin forming at 8:45 a.m. All should bring their academic regalia with them.

The Commencement address will be delivered by Bishop Francis R. Shea, who will receive an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree. Other honorary degree recipients are Clifford Alfred Kleymeyer, Aline Nunn Renner, and L. Bernard Powers, who will receive honorary Doctor of Laws.
