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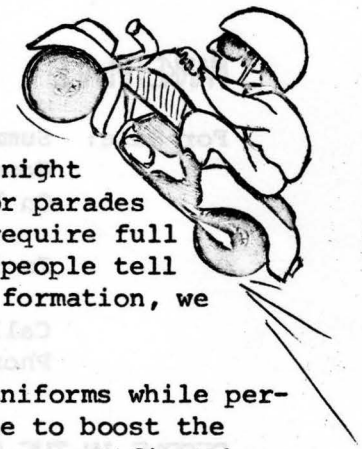
BENEFACTOR DIES

Mrs. Loren (Rosemary) Herrli died Wednesday, May 15 as a result of a stroke she suffered Wednesday morning. The wife of Loren Herrli, a member of the ISUE Foundation Board of Directors, Rosemary was active in the Westwood Garden Club, and aided the club as they developed the Bent Twig area and Westwood Lodge on the campus. She

was also active in Simpson Methodist Church, the National Audubon Society, and the Evansville Association for the Blind Auxiliary.

Jim bought his motorcycle in 1970 and drills each Thursday night with the Patrol at Roberts Stadium. The main formations for parades are the figure eight and the double circle, both of which require full concentration and lots of practice. As Jim says, "Several people tell me they've seen me in different parades, but when we're in formation, we don't have time to look for anyone."

Members of the Motor Patrol own their own cycles and wear uniforms while performing. There are presently 35 members and they would like to boost the membership to 50. To become a member of the Hadi Shrine, one must first become a 32nd degree Mason.

Last year the Motor Patrol transported their own cycles to Atlanta, Georgia, to the Imperial Potentates Grand Session. They performed in 3 eight-hour long parades while there. In the future, they plan to travel to Kansas City, Canada and Hawaii.

The Motor Patrol, aside from the fun of participating in parades and various functions, also help support the Crippled Childrens' Hospital in St. Louis. Any proceeds or funds raised go to a rung (at \$60.00 a rung) on the Ladder of Smiles at the hospital. The smiles this money brings at the Children's Hospital is worth all the effort put forth by these performing Shriners.
