

Current facilities, including a Science Center and Administration Building, Library, University Center and Technology Center, are being utilized by a 2945 member student body. Auxiliary buildings used by students include the ISUE Central Arena, the ISUE Children's Center, the Art Center and the ISUE Playhouse.

The institution is accredited by the North Central Association, the Indiana State Department of Public Instruction, the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education, and the Council on Dental Education of the American Dental Association.

Curricular opportunities are offered in 60 programs under fouryear baccalaureate degree programs, two-year associate degree programs and one-year certificate programs.

WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE Athletic Director & Basketball Coach



Wayne Boultinghouse, in his second season at the helm of the ISUE athletic program, was appointed director of athletics and head basketball coach in the summer of 1974

Charged with rebuilding ISUE's basketball program, Coach Boulting-house made tremendous progress in the area of recruiting this year. "We had a fine recruiting season," comments Coach Wayne Boultinghouse, "and we are confident that we have

the talent available to have a winning season." Despite the challenge of the strongest schedule in the schools' history, the blend of experience, size and quickness should produce the first winning record for the Eagles. Boultinghouse's eye for competition and desire to strengthen the Eagles basketball schedule has added yet another challenge to ISUE during the 1975-76 season when the Eagles will battle university division opponents Mercer and Ole Miss in a pair of games to open the season. The schedule will also include such perennial powers as Austin Peay, Tennessee State and former NCAA National Champion Kentucky Wesleyan.

A native of Rockport, IN., Coach Boultinghouse was a standout player at Rockport and at the University of Evansville where he lettered as a basketball and a baseball player. Boultinghouse is one of the few coaches who has played and coached on a NCAA basketball championship team. (University of Evansville - 1964-1971)

"We are going to have the luxury of depth and this should have a positive effect on our program," concludes Coach Boultinghouse. If all goes as planned the fans of ISUE will have more occasions for

celebrating during the 1975-76 basketball season.

Coach Boultinghouse's wife, Billie, is a teacher at Harrison High School. She, too, is involved in athletics and coaches the Warriors women's gymnastics and golf teams.

Ass't. Coach Don Ramsden begins his second year on the ISUE basket-ball staff. Aside from his varsity coaching duties, Don takes charge of the junior varsity and the scouting assignments. He also played an active role in the successful recruiting season the Eagles experienced this year.

Don works in the Veteran's Affairs Office at ISUE and administers the institution's intramural program. The former University of

Evansville graduate and Air Force Captain received his M.A. from Chapman College in 1973. Don and his wife Ginger have two children; David 6 and Amy 3.

After graduation from Owensboro High School, Coach Larry Shown was drafted and signed by the New York Yankee organization. The six years Larry invested with the Yankees added experience and knowledge to a good solid foundation of baseball history.

Coach Shown started his love for baseball at the age of six and has en-

joyed it thoroughly ever since. Larry will be the first to admit that he is still a kid at heart and hopes that he doesn't ever loose his boyish trait.

Larry is a transfer student from Kentucky Wesleyan College where he attended his freshman year and played for the Panthers Basketball Team. He also assisted in coaching the baseball team. Larry has the distinction of being the oldest freshman playing basketball in the state of Kentucky and possibly of being the oldest freshman basketball player in the nation last year.
