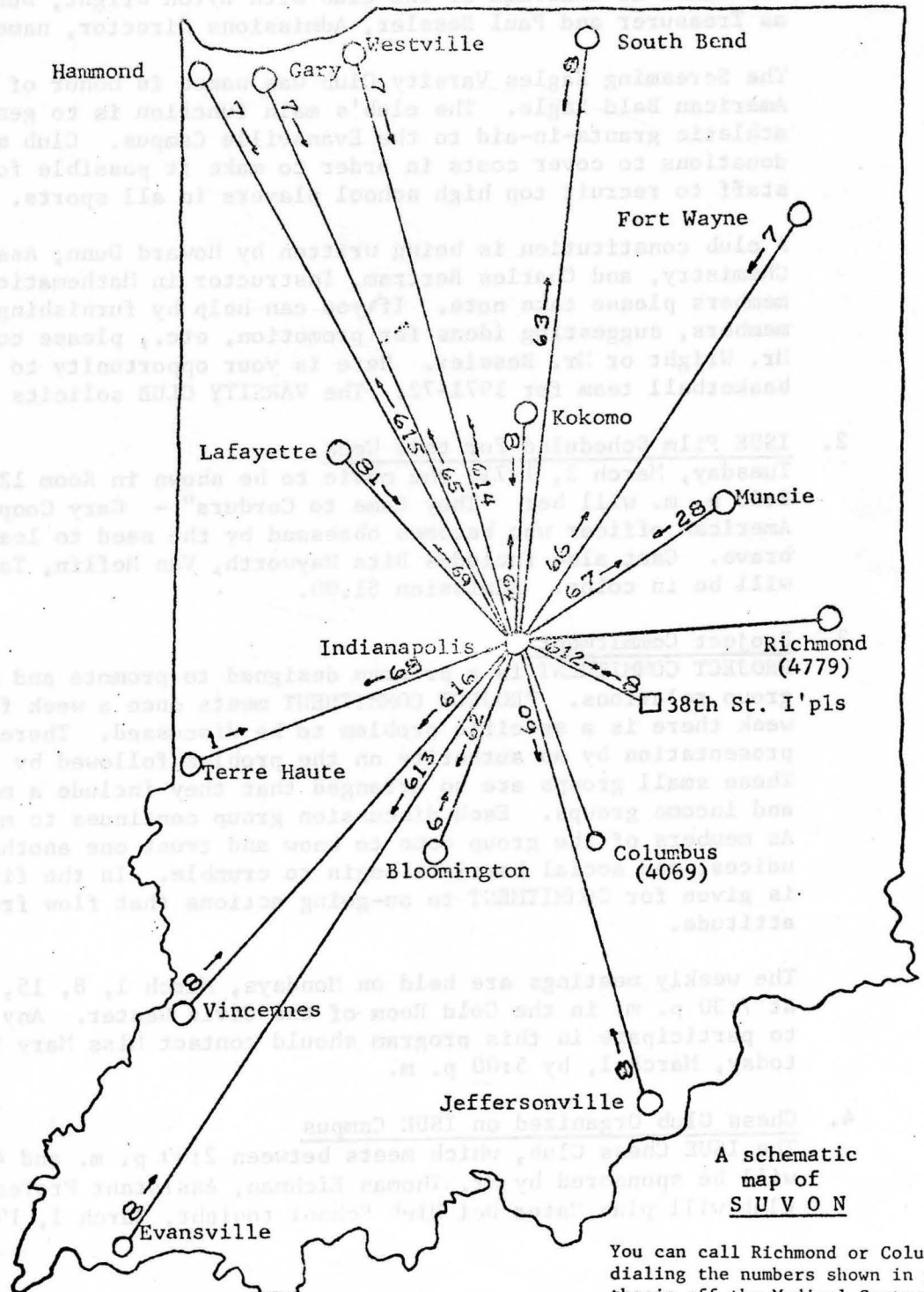
4. Chess Club Organized on ISUE Campus
