10. Scheduling Use of Automatic Typewriter

Guidelines for Use of Duplicating Processes are:

1. Sign up - When you know the date and amount of time Flexo-writer use is needed, sign the reservation sheet provided by the secretary in Admissions, listing date and time.
2. If there is a change in actual hours of usage needed, make corrections on the reservation sheet.
3. When finished with any and all tapes, log them with copy from each in central file maintained by the Admissions secretary.
4. If an exceptionally large project involving Flexo-writer is planned, notify Admissions secretary so adequate tape and ribbon supply may be arranged.
