EAGLES TO OPEN SEASON SATURDAY. The ISUE Eagles will open the season Saturday, December 1 at home against Hillsdale.

Listening to head coach WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE, one might believe the ISUE basketball team will have its best season ever.

"This should be the best shooting team we've ever had and it has the potential to be the best defensive team," said BOULTINGHOUSE.

BOULTINGHOUSE has determined a starting lineup. He's elected to go with 6-foot-4 senior Clovis McDowell and 6-1 senior Dan Labhart at the guard spots, 6-4 sophomore John Brown and 6-7 senior John Alexander at forward and 7-6 junior center John Hollinden for the opener.

Hillsdale is said by at least one preseason magazine to be one of the nation's top four NAIA teams and an NCAA Division II member.

BOULTINGHOUSE wasn't ready to make any predictions about the number of victories he expects the Eagles to attain this season. "I've always felt that our most important game is our next game - and that's Hillsdale right now," he said.
