Foreign exchange trader to speak at USI

The Tri-State World Trade Council will present "Foreign Exchange – Mitigate Risk, Make Some Cash, or Lose Your Shirt!" from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., Thursday, May 17, in Carter Hall, in the University Center, on the University of Southern Indiana campus.

The program will feature Joe Areddy, assistant vice president, Fifth Third Bank. His presentation will address minimizing foreign exchange currency risk by using spots, forwards, options, and other foreign exchange products to facilitate international trade.

Areddy, a foreign exchange trader in the International Department of Fifth Third's corporate headquarters in Cincinnati, is responsible for bank affiliates in Cincinnati, Indianapolis, and Southern Indiana.

An Indiana native, he graduated from Indiana University in 1992, the same year he began his career at Fifth Third. Areddy worked in credit risk and in various other commercial division departments before becoming a foreign exchange trader in 1994.

The cost of the program, including lunch, is \$10 for Tri-State WTC members registering by Monday, May 14, or \$15 at the door; \$15 for non-members registering by Monday, May 14, or \$20 at the door.
