CONGRATULATIONS TO HOMECOMING QUEEN AND KING. Congratulations to Victoria Johnson and Kenny Zuber who were selected to reign over the 1983-84 Homecoming Court. Victoria was sponsored by Alpha Sigma Alpha, and Kenny was sponsored by Lamda Chi Alpha.

Tonja Pitzer was chosen Maid-of-Honor, while Joe Aldridge was voted first runner up to King. Those selected as second runner up to King and Queen were Scott Alan Toelle and Tami Cassidy, respectively.

McNaughton WINS MID STATES. Mr. John McNaughton, professor of art at ISUE, won the "best of show" award in the Mid States Crafts Exhibit at the Evansville Museum of Arts and Science. His entry, "Princess, Are You Almost Ready?" was favored by jurors over the 308 other entries from six Midwestern states in the prestigious 24th annual craft competition. Professor McNaughton was awarded the \$1,000 Museum Guild Award top prize. His wood sculpture, a five-foot high structure of tables stacked on top of each other, is complete with wooden pillows, compacts, combs, mascara and hand mirrors, becoming progressively smaller, "taking you from reality to a child-like fantasy world," McNaughton said. It is one of the 100 crafts now on display in the Museum's main gallery.

WOMEN'S HISTORY CELEBRATION REMINDER. ISUE, in cooperation with several area organizations, is sponsoring a Women's History Celebration during national Women's History Week, March 4 - 10.

Activities scheduled each day will center on four separate themes - women in politics, women in religion, women in the arts, and women and wellness. Community organizations are sponsoring several of the programs in conjunction with their usual meetings.

On Sunday, March 4, the Old North United Methodist Church Women and the Forum Sunday School Class will discuss "The Meaning of the Lectionary for Christians" at 11:00 a.m. at Old North, 4201 Stringtown Road. Other community organizations participating include the American Association of University Women, which is sponsoring "Women - They Way We Were, The Way We Are," a reader's theatre at the YWCA Monday, March 5 at 7:30 p.m.; the National Organization for Women, sponsoring a session on "Recruiting Women Delegates to Political Conventions," Tuesday, March 6 at 7:00 p.m. at the Unitarian Fellowship, 865 South Kentucky Avenue; and the Evansville Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta, sponsoring "Wondrous Women - The Story of Outstanding Black Women of Evansville," by storyteller Alfreida Churchill, 7:30 p.m. at the East Branch Library, 840 E. Chandler Avenue. The Junior League of Evansville and the League of Women Voters of Southwest Indiana also are sponsoring organizations.

Free wellness classes will be at 7:30 p.m. in the ISUE Physical Activities Center, Monday through Thursday and at 3:00 p.m. Saturday. Topics will be aerobics, weight training, aquacize, jogging and wellness lifestyle.

On both Thursday and Saturday, a daylong current issues forum will be offered at ISUE. Topics include the four themes of the celebration as well as seminars on peacemaking, nuclear issues, and women's health issues. An exhibit by ISUE women art students will begin Thursday, March 8 and continue through Saturday, March 10 in the ISUE University Conference Center.

On Friday, participants will have an opportunity to dine amid the art as they celebrate women in the arts. Josephine Elliott, ISUE archivist emerita, will speak at 10:00 a.m. in the Conference Center. Her topic will be "Madame Marie Fretageot - Progressive Educator in the Owen-McClure Communitarian Experiment in New Harmony." Following her address, a brunch (\$3.75) will be served in the Conference Center. At noon, the ISUE Readers' Theatre will present "Women - The Way We Were, The Way We Are," a poignant and sometimes humorous look at women.

All programs are free and open to the public. Modest fees are charged for lunch and brunch, with advance reservations required.
