## 2001 USI Baseball Outlook

NCAA II Tournament: 1979, 1983, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1994 GLVC Championships: 1983, 1985, 1993 GLVC Regular Season Championships: 1992, 1993

The 2001 University of Southern Indiana baseball team will have a new look this spring. With the graduation of 10 players in 2000, USI **Head Coach Mike Goedde** will have a lot of new faces to integrate into the line-up.

Beginning his eighth season at the helm, Goedde has led USI to a 206-149 (.580) record in seven years. Goedde is just 14 wins away from tying Larry Shown for the USI all-time record with 220 wins.

Entering 2001, Goedde will rely on 13 returning players to balance and help direct the 14 new competitors on the field.

Gone from last season's squad is Mike Peerman, USI's all-time leader in hits, and Rob Bowers, USI's season record holder in saves and appearances.

On the mound, USI will begin with a veteran set of hurlers. Leading the way is senior right-hander **Jon Adams** (Ft. Branch, Indiana), who had a 3-1 record and a 2.78 ERA in 11 games last season for USI.

He is followed by senior left-hander **Aaron Piening** (Indianapolis, Indiana), who was 3-3 in 10 games and eight starts, and junior right-hander **Steve Arnold** (Evansville, Indiana), who was 2-1 out of the bullpen with a 4.91 ERA.

The Eagles also return senior right-hander Jay Winters (Shawneetown, Illinois), who had 18 strikeouts in 45 innings out of the pen, while sophomore right-hander **Dustin Macke** (Evansville, Indiana) will be expected to pick up some of the slack from USI's six departing hurlers.

New to the mound for USI in 2001 are three transfers, a senior, and two juniors.

Senior right-hander **Kylan Stuck** (Carmel, Indiana) comes north from Delta State University to join Piening, a former teammate at Carmel High School. Stuck was 7-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 20 appearances for DSU as a junior.

Coming to the team as juniors are right-hander **Mike Schrader** (Covington, Indiana) and lefthander **Darren Weeks** (Forrest, Illinois). Schrader was 8-2 with a 2.50 ERA at Danville Area College.

New to the USI rotation in 2001 are freshmen right-handers **Drew Neel** (Newburgh, Indiana) and **Nathan Esche** (Mt. Vernon, Indian); and freshmen left-handers **Toby Pritchard** (Ft. Wayne, Indiana), **Blake Chambers** (Washington, Indiana), **Cory Macke** (Evansville, Indiana), and **Andrew Renn** (Floyds Knobs, Indiana).

In the field and at the plate the Eagles return five starters from last season's line-up. The top returning player at the plate is junior thirdbaseman **Brian Branson** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), who hit .263 with six doubles, three home runs, and 23 RBIs.

Next to him on the infield are sophomores shortstop Josh Perkins (Lafayette, Indiana) and sophomore second baseman Adam Schiff (Evansville, Indiana).

Perkins, who led off for much of his freshman season, hitting .259 with six doubles, two home runs, and 24 RBIs, but will have work on his fielding, committing a team-high 30 errors.

Schiff fought through a first-half slump at the plate to shine in the second half of his freshman season. He hit .245 for the season with 19 RBIs, hitting .283 in the final 22 games.

Sophomore **John Hodge** (Evansville, Indiana) was plugged into the line-up late last season at first base due to injuries. He will get a hard look to be the starter in the preseason. Senior catchers **Andy Cook** (Evansville, Indiana) and **Greg Baisden** (Schererville, Indiana) will give the USI hurlers two solid backstops, while junior transfer **Brian Scroggins** (East Alton, Illinois) will add punch to the line-up.

Scroggins hit .405 with a .690 slugging percentage at Lewis and Clark Community College. He also contributed 20 runs and six round-trippers.

Patrolling the wide expanses of the USI outfield will be with four returning players and a transfer.

The transfer is sophomore **Andy Nucci** (Ft. Wayne, Indiana), who hit .388 with 50 RBIs, 12 doubles, and three triples as a freshman at Huntington College.

Of the four returning players, the Eagles have a junior and three sophomores. Junior **Marcus Renn** (Floyds Knobs, Indiana) played in 52 of USI's 55 games, patrolling centerfield with a .977 fielding percentage.

Also competing for the outfield slots will be sophomores **Justin Konopacki** (Ft. Wayne, Indiana) and **Neil Duckworth** (Henderson, Kentucky). The Eagles will have to be ready to compete with the first pitch. USI will play three teams which were in the NCAA Division II Tournament last year and four teams which were ranked in the *Collegiate Baseball* Preseason Top 25.

In the GLVC, the Eagles will play at home against preseason ranked University of Indianapolis  $(11^{th})$ , Quincy University  $(19^{th})$ , and Southern Illinois University Edwardsville  $(30^{th})$ . Indianapolis finished third in the NCAA II Tournament in 2000.

The non-conference schedule will be a tough one. USI will play on the road against Kennesaw State University, which was an NCAA II Tournament team and ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the preseason.

Overall, USI will play six schools in Division II that averaged a combined 37 wins last season.

The squad also will play at NCAA Division I team Murray State University.

## Mike Goedde Head Coach

In 2001, University of Southern Indiana Head Coach Mike Goedde will be directing the Screaming Eagles baseball for an eighth season and working to become the USI all-time winningest coach.

The native of Evansville, Indiana, completed the 2000 campaign with a seven year record of 206-149 (.580) second all-time at USI, just 14 victories behind Larry Shown who was 220-230 in 11 seasons (1976-87). USI was 24-31 in 2000, 12-14 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

Goedde steered the Eagles on a course to a 30-win season in 1999, completing the year at 34-19 overall, 17-10 in the GLVC. USI also led the league in hitting (.319) with wood bats and lowered the ERA to a respectable 4.59.

In 1998, Goedde completed his fifth season with a 26-19 overall record, 9-13 GLVC. His team was one of the most offensive-minded in USI history, setting the school record for batting average for the second straight season and boasting three .400 hitters

During the 1997 campaign, Goedde steered the Eagles to a 30-16 overall record and a 16-9 conference mark, missing the league divisional playoffs by a half game. At the conclusion of the season, he had led the Eagles to the 30-win mark for the second time in six seasons, and back into the regional races.

He successfully led the 1996 team to a 27-22 overall, 14-12 in the GLVC, while leading the 1995 team to a 29-23 record and a 10-8 GLVC record, just missing the GLVC Tournament each year.

In his first season, Goedde led the Eagles to a 36-19 record and berths in the Great Lakes Valley Conference and NCAA Division II Central Region tournaments.

Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville (UE) under Head Coach Jim Brownlee from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993.

While Goedde was at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA in the country with a 2.99. This staff featured major league All-Star Andy Benes, who plays professionally in Arizona Diamondbacks.

In professional baseball, Goedde was signed as a pitcher in the fourth round of the 1983 draft by the Cincinnati Reds and spent three seasons in their farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Cincinnati Reds organization in the Pioneer League at Billings, Mont.

Goedde graduated from UE with a degree in sports administration, and from Evansville's Mater Dei High School. He will marry Soozie Taber on July 18.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is a physical education instructor at USI.

## **Chris Barney**

Assistant Coach

Assistant Coach Chris Barney returns for his eighth season at USI as the hitting instructor, works with the infielders and outfielders, and coaches third base. The Eagles finished first in the GLVC in 1999 with a .319 team batting average while using wood bats.

Barney joined Goedde's staff in 1993-94 after spending the 1992-93 year at Tusculum College in Greenville, TN. Prior to working at Tusculum, Barney spent three-and-a-half years (1989-92) with Tennessee Wesleyan College as an assistant coach. At both schools, he was responsible for daily practices, field maintenance, and fund raising projects.

As the head coach of the Quincy Gems of the Central Illinois Collegiate League, Barney's teams have won the CICL Tournament Championship twice (1996 and 1998), the Western Division twice (1998 and 1999), and had the best overall record in the CICL in 1998 with a 40-10 record. In four seasons, he has a record of 126-59 (.697).

Barney has worked summer baseball camps in Florida, Tennessee, Indiana, and Michigan. In 1995, he managed the Chet Lemon Juice 14 year old team that went on to the National AAU Tournament held in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and finished fifth.

Barney, a 1992 graduate of Tennessee Wesleyan with a degree in business administration, coached the Quincy Gems in their inaugural season and won a Tournament Championship in the summer of 1996.
