GRANT RECEIVED. The ISUE Office of Continuing Education has received a grant from the Indiana Committee for the Humanities for a Women's History Celebration March 7 through 18, 1983. During the two-week period, which includes National Women's History Week March 6-12, several presentations will illustrate the contributions of women to literature, drama, history, art, poetry, music, science, and government.
