


Mike Hillyard Men's and women's cross country coach

Mike Hillyard, head coach of both the men's and women's cross country programs, has the women's team in the top ten nationally and the men's program quickly returning to their past glories.

Last season in cross country, the 1999 women's squad finished in the top ten nationally for the second consecutive year. The Lady Eagles finished second in the Great Lakes Valley Conference championships, won their first-ever Great Lakes Regional, and then went on to finish ninth at the NCAA II National Finals.

For his efforts during the 1999 cross country season, he was named GLVC Coach of the Year and the NCAA II Cross Country Coaches Association Newsletter November Great Lakes Region Coach of the Month.

In 2000 track and field, Hillyard saw his women's program continue down the right path with a Melissa Eddy qualifing for the NCAA Division II Indoor Nationals and Kelly Cunningham being named the Indiana Intercollegiate Outdoor Track Female Athlete of the Meet. With only distance runners, USI also took sixth in both the GLVC Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

In 1998, the Screaming Eagles produced an eighth-place showing in the NCAA Division II National Championships, a second place performance in the Great Lakes Regional, and their first-ever Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship.

In 1997, just his second season as head coach, Hillyard led the women's cross country team into the national spotlight. The Eagles gained their first-ever birth in the NCAA II National Championship, finishing 12th in the nation.

In addition to moving up among the national leaders, Hillyard has directed the Eagles to three of their five consecutive Indiana Intercollegiate "Little State" championships.

With such admirable credentials with the women's program, Hillyard was chosen to continue the men's tradition-rich program left by legendary coach Bill Stegemoller.

The 1999 men's cross country season saw the Eagles take second in the GLVC Championships which propelled them into the 2000 track and field season. The highlight of the 2000 track season was David Farmer being named the Freshman of the Year at the GLVC Indoor Track and Field Championships.

In 1998, his first season as men's coach, Hillyard helped guide Ben Kapsoiya to a third place finish in the NCAA II Championships. Last year, the Eagles barely missed an NCAA II National Final invite after finishing third in the Great Lakes Regional. Only the top two teams were invited.

Hillyard was a member of the USI cross country team in 1991 and 1992. While under the tutelage of coach Stegemoller, Hillyard excelled, earning All-American status in track and field with his fifth place finish in the steeplechase at the 1992 NCAA Division II Championships. Hillyard finished 34th in the 1991 NCAA Division II Cross Country Nationals.

A native of Norris City, Illinois, and a 1994 USI graduate, Hillyard and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Madison.

2000-01 Men's Cross Country to make run at nationals

The University of Southern Indiana men's cross country team came very close to advancing to its 13th appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championships in 1999, a task the Screaming Eagles will be shooting for in 2000.

"We were very close to getting out of the region last fall," said **USI Head Coach Mike Hillyard**. "Our younger guys learned a lot from the experience and they have a better
understanding of what they must do to prepare. Right now, there is a real sense of urgency on the
team to get back to the national meet."

The Eagles finished the 1999 season with a second place showing at the Great Lakes Valley Conference Championships along with the fourth place finish at the regional championship.

Back to lead the team this fall is senior **Jon Jacob** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), who was named All-Great Lakes Valley Conference after taking second at the GLVC Championships with a 10k time of 32:39.90. Jacob was on his way to passing that time at the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Championships, but gave way to heat exhaustion in the final stretch of the race.

"Jon put together a good season in 1999," commented Hillyard. "He was running very well at the regional before the heat took him down. His desire is stronger than ever after watching several runners that he had beaten earn All-American honors at the national meet. He knows he should be an All-American."

Jacob, a two-time All-GLVC performer who has had back-to-back impressive seasons for the Screaming Eagles, is one of three seniors on a team which includes six sophomores and three juniors. Also returning for their final season are **Matt Krack** (Evansyille, Indiana), who just missed being named All-GLVC and All-Region; **Ben Stover** (Henderson, Kentucky), and **Tim Roman** (Evansyille, Indiana).

Of the nine underclassmen returning to run for USI, the squad is led by junior **Jeff Rumsey** (Rising Sun, Indiana) and sophomore **Dominic Ventura** (Indianapolis, Indiana). Ventura was named All-GLVC with a season-best 10th place finish in the league meet, while Rumsey had a season-best sixth place showing in the Stegemoller Classic.

Also returning for his second season is sophomore **Miles Krieger** (Floyds Knobs, Indiana), who finished as part of USI's top five finishers in four of six meets. Krieger, who was the GLVC runner-up in the 10k and All-Conference last spring, had a season best seventh place showing in the Stegemoller Classic.

2000 Women's Cross Country enjoys national spotlight

The University of Southern Indiana women's cross country team finished 1999 as the best squad in the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Region and would like to be recognized as one of the top teams in the nation in 2000.

The Screaming Eagles completed the 1999 season by capturing the Great Lakes Valley Conference and the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional crowns and advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championships for the third consecutive season. USI placed ninth at the national championships.

Senior **Melissa Eddy** (Hope, Indiana) will lead the squad into 2000. She was USI's number one runner in four of the team's seven meets and was All-GLVC and All-Great Lakes Region.

Eddy will be joined by five other seniors, including Kelly Cunningham (Bloomfield, Indiana), Erin Gilles (Lafayette, Indiana), Emily Maier (Griffin, Indiana), Nicole Shepler (Noblesville, Indiana), and Jessica Vagedes (Gosport, Indiana).

"This is a special year for us," said **USI Head Coach Mike Hillyard.** "These six young ladies have been here to see the transition take place from mediocrity to regional champions. They are largely responsible for the success we have had over the past three years."

Hillyard will be welcoming back Shepler, who missed last season with stress fractures in both legs. Shepler was All-Region, two-time All-GLVC, and 28th at the 1998 nationals for cross country.

Of the underclassmen, the Eagles will be expecting a strong season from sophomore **Jenny Farmer** (Princeton, Indiana). Farmer was All-GLVC with a seventh place showing at the GLVC Championships and All-Region after finishing 10th at the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional.

"In 1999, she put together the best freshman season we have ever seen at USI," Hillyard said of his super sophomore.

Also new to the roster this fall is senior **Alisha McDaniel** (Evansville, Indiana), who comes to the Eagles from Indiana State. She comes with impressive credentials (17:50 in the 5k) and should make a big impact.

Jim Brown Men's golf coach

Jim Brown joined the University of Southern Indiana faculty in 1970, becoming the men's golf coach in 1977 and the women's golf coach in 1995. He also is the academic advisor to the USI student athletes.

As the men's coach, Brown's Screaming Eagles made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship in 1996, and have made five consecutive appearances in the NCAA II North Regional. During his tenure, Brown has coached eight All-Great Lakes Valley Conference players and three Academic All-Americans.

In 1995, Brown helped organize the women's golf program and has served as coach since the programs creation. The women's program has improved each year, becoming a challenger for the GLVC title the last two seasons taking second in 1999 and third in 1998. In the 1999 GLVC championships, Brown's Eagles led after the first two rounds and finished only four strokes off the pace. The team completed the 1999-2000 season with a 62-38 record in 12 tournaments.

Beyond their accomplishments on the golf course, Brown's teams excel in the classroom. Since the creation of the Academic All-GLVC award in 1991, the golf program has had six men's players and two women's players named to individual conference teams for academics.

During his years at the University, Brown has been the head baseball coach, assistant basketball coach, sports information director, and intramural director. He retired from the USI Physical Education Department after the 1999-2000 school year.

Brown received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Emporia State University (Emporia, Kansas) in 1962 and a master's degree in physical education from Indiana University in 1968.

Men's Golf wants to take the next step in 2000-01

Head coach Jim Brown returns the nucleus of a 1999 University of Southern Indiana men's golf team that made its fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Division II North Regional Tournament. In 2000, the Eagles hope to advance to the national finals for the first time since 1996.

Coach Brown, who is in his 23rd season at USI, also wants to use the fall to prepare for the stretch drive in the spring when the Eagles go for their sixth consecutive appearance in the NCAA II Tournament.

In 2000, the Eagles want to improve upon a seventh place finish in the 1999 Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament and defend their first place finish in the Kentucky Wesleyan Spring Invitational. In 1999, the Eagles finished third in five of 15 tournaments.

Back to lead the squad to national prominence is senior **Matt Scheessele** (Evansville, Indiana), whose 77.5 shots per round (spr) average was best on the team in 1999-2000. Scheessele was the Eagles' top finisher in five tournaments, including the NCAA II North Regional Tournament and the NCAA II District IV Spring Tournament. He also was named All-GLVC for the second straight season.

Senior **Mark Franklin** (Clayton, Indiana) followed closely behind Scheessele with a 78.4 spr average, leading the squad at the GLVC Tournament with a three-day 229 (+16). He had a season best 75 in the first round of the NCAA II District IV Tournament.

The final three positions will be up for grabs between four sophomores and three freshmen.

Returning for their second season are sophomores **Tim Garner** (Martinsville, Indiana), **Charlie Lane** (Bicknell, Indiana), **Andy Skodinski** (New Ross, Indiana), and **Brett Smith** (Jasper, Indiana). Skodinski is the top returning sophomore with a 79.5 spr average in 12 tournaments, while Smith and Lane averaged 81.3 spr and 82.7 spr respectively.

Teeing up at the first hole as freshmen are **Mike Cole** (Indianapolis, Indiana), **Chad Horrell** (Evansville, Indiana), and **Zach Smith** (Evansville, Indiana).

USI's fall schedule will culminate with the GLVC tournament in early October before resuming their spring schedule in March of 2001.

Don Bisesi joined the USI coaching staff in the spring of 2000 as the women's golf coach, leading the team to a first place showing in the Kentucky Wesleyan Invitational, a second place finish in the Lewis Spring Invitational, and a third in the Quad City Invitational.

In addition to his duties on the USI staff, Bisesi is the professional and manager of Helfrich Hills Golf Course, positions he has held since 1977. Prior to his tenure at Helfrich, he was the director of golf at Club of Prestwick in Danville, Indiana, and the head professional at Plainfield Elks Country Club in Plainfield, Indiana.

Bisesi also was an assistant professional at Whittle Spring Golf Course in Knoxville, Tennessee, and at the Highland Golf and Country Club in Indianapolis, Indiana.

On the links, Bisesi played on the PGA Senior Tour from 1988 to 1989, finishing as the Indiana PGA Senior Golf Champion and the Indiana PGA Senior Open runner-up in 1988. He also played in four PGA Senior Tour events and one national PGA Senior Championship.

A graduate of the University of Indianapolis with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education, Bisesi was All-Conference each of his four seasons, won two conference championships, and finished in the top 20 in two national NAIA golf championships. He was inducted into the University of Indianapolis Sports Hall of Fame in 1999.

Bisesi, a 30-year member of the Professional Golfers' Association (PGA) and a former Indiana PGA board member, has been a major force in the state of Indiana in promoting junior golf. He was named Indiana Junior Golf Promoter of the Year in 1988.

A native of Martinsville, Indiana, Bisesi has a master's degree from Indiana University in guidance and counseling. He and his wife, DeLaine, reside in Evansville.

Women's golf to make a run for the GLVC crown during the fall

The University of Southern Indiana women's golf program starts the 2000-01 season as a team on the move. The Screaming Eagles have improved dramatically in the past year and could be a team to reckon with this year.

Returning is senior standout **Laura Compton** (Evansville, Indiana), who paced USI in 10 of its 12 tournaments last season. Compton set a USI two-round record with a 158 third-place finish in the GLVC Tournament. The All-GLVC performer, who led USI with an 83.3 shots per round (spr) average in 1999-2000, also won the USI Fall Invitational and the Kentucky Wesleyan Spring Invitational.

Compton tied the USI single round record of 78 for a third and fourth time at the Indianapolis Fall Preview and the GLVC Tournament.

Following Compton closely is senior **Lindsey McGrath** (Kentland, Indiana). McGrath, who also was named All-GLVC last season, placed fifth in the GLVC Tournament with a two-day 162 and led USI in four tournaments. She tied a personal best and fell one stroke short of the USI single round record with a 79 at Saint Joseph's Fall Invitational, the GLVC Tournament, and the Lewis University Spring Invitational.

McGrath tied Compton for the top average in the spring with an 85.2 spr average, finishing the year with an 84.2 spr average.

Returning behind Compton and McGrath is junior **Kristy Herndon** (Greensburg, Indiana). Herndon, who missed much of the fall season, joined the team for the GLVC Tournament, helping to propel the team to a second place finish. She reached a season-best 87 at the conference tournament and at the Lewis Invitational in the spring and averaged 92.5 spr for the year.

Also coming back for a second season is sophomore **Stephanie Murray** (Boonville, Indiana). She saved her best round for last with a season-best 90 at the Franklin College Spring Classic.

Head Coach Don Bisesi enters his first full season in charge of the USI women's golf program and has added five freshmen to give the team depth. Freshmen Jennifer Beaman (Evansville, Indiana), Michelle Hamilton (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), Brandi Irvin (Benton, Illinois), Laura Nichols (Avon, Indiana), and Melissa Penman (Brazil, Indiana) are all expected to help the Eagles move farther in 2000-01.

This fall, the Eagles will try to repeat as champions of the USI Fall Invitational and both Kentucky Wesleyan Invitationals, while shooting to take their first every GLVC Tournament title.

KEELY PORTER Women's tennis coach

For nine seasons, Head Coach Keely Porter has focused the University of Southern Indiana women's tennis team on finishing in the upper division of the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

In 1999, Porter led a surprising young USI squad to a 10-5 overall record, 6-4 GLVC. The squad, which included five freshmen, four sophomores, and two juniors tied for third in the GLVC Tournament after finishing the regular season in fourth place. Porter also has begun to expand the program by introducing a partial spring schedule in 2000.

In addition to coaching at USI, Porter is the head pro at Rolling Hills Country Club in Newburgh, Indiana, and on staff at Advantage Court and Fitness (formerly the Executive Inn Athletic Club) in Evansville. She is a United States Professional Tennis Registry certified pro, with 15 years of teaching experience.

In her USI career, Porter has accumulated a 69-54 (.561) overall record and a 46-37 (.554) record in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. She has led the Screaming Eagles to fourth-place finishes in league play during the 1991, 1995, 1996, and 1997 seasons.

Porter, a native of Newburgh, is a 1984 graduate of the University of Evansville with a bachelor's degree in geography and anthropology. As a student athlete, Porter was the number one singles player and still holds the U of E record for career doubles winning percentage.

Along with her duties in the Athletic Department, Porter is a member of the Physical Education Department faculty.

Women's tennis heading for another successful season

Underclassmen secure promising future

The University of Southern Indiana women's tennis team had one of their best seasons ever in 1999, reaching double digits in victories for the second time this decade. The Screaming Eagles finished fourth in the conference, and freshman **Emily Blinzinger** (Oakland City, Indiana) took home Freshman of the Year accolades in the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

The Lady Eagles 10-5 (.667) regular-season mark is the best ever under **Head Coach Keely Porter's** tutelage. Porter has a 69-54 overall record, 46-37 GLVC, in 10 seasons with the Eagles.

Blinzinger was the first USI women's tennis player since 1997 to be named All-GLVC and the only member of the Lady Eagles to make the All-Conference squad last season. She played at the number one singles position in every match for the Lady Eagles and finished the regular season with a 12-3 individual record, including 8-2 in the GLVC. She also teamed with freshman **Jamie Carie** (Washington, Indiana) at number one doubles to register a 9-6 overall record, 6-3 in the GLVC.

USI Eagles had four first-year players in the top four singles slots last season. Carie played number two singles and posted a 6-11 overall record. Sophomore **Gwen Gosman** (Jasper, Indiana) competed at number four singles and recorded a 10-4 record, 5-3 in the GLVC. Gosman and former Lady Eagle Gretchen Miles teamed up to post a 14-6 (5-5 GLVC) record in number two doubles.

Junior Emily Nall (Mt. Vernon, Indiana) finished 10-2, 7-2 GLVC, at number five singles, while sophomore Jill Clements (Loogootee, Indiana) tallied a 13-2 record at number six singles, including an impressive 6-1 record in conference play.

The youthful Eagles seemed to become even younger with the addition of a junior and three freshmen to the roster. Joining the team is junior **Michelle Lenahan** (Vincennes, Indiana) and freshmen **Stephanie Baxter** (Sellersburg, Indiana), **Nicole Freyberger** (Jasper, Indiana), and **Jenny Ravellette** (Vincennes, Indiana).

Lenahan transferred to USI from Marian College where she was a two-time All-Conference performer (1998 and 1999) and was a 1997 qualifier for the "westerns" in the Central Indiana Tennis Association. Baxter led Silver Creek High School to the 2000 sectional and regional championships, finishing as the semi-state finalist, while Freyberger helped Jasper High School to the regional championship in 1999 and sectional crowns from 1996 through 1999.

Ravellette helped Vincennes Lincoln High School to the semi-state finals as a freshman and to the regional finals in her final three seasons.
