"T. S. Eliot: Tradition and Talent - A Centennial Celebration" will be the opening program for the fall Liberal Arts Forum series (formerly the Humanities Forum) at the University of Southern Indiana.

The public is invited to attend the program at 2 p.m. Thursday, September 29, in Forum III. There will be readings from Eliot's poems and plays and a panel discussion on his contributions to 20th century poetry, drama, and literary and social criticism. USI students James Angermeier, Judy Berberich, Jane Fulkerson, Jill McDonald, Gail Moore, Veronica Stephens, and Rusty White will be the readers and panelists.

Eliot was a St. Louis native and son of the founder of Washington University. His work earned him the 1947 Nobel Prize for Literature.
