7. Alicia de Larrocha, famous Spanish pianist, with Philharmonic

Alicia de Larrocha, the Spanish born pianist, will be the attraction with the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra, Sunday at 3:15, March 9, and Monday evening at 8:30 p. m. March 10, at Vanderburgh Auditorium.

Following "Carnival Overture, Opus 92, Dvorak, conducted by Minas Christian, Miss de Larrocha will be featured in Mozart's "Concerto in A Major for Piano and Orchestra, K. 488". After intermission she will play "Nights in the Gardens of Spain," Manuel de Falla, which she has presented with the Chicago Symphony in New York's Carnegie Hall.

The Orchestra will close the program with three orchestral pieces from "The Damnation of Faust," Berlioz.
