REGISTRATION BEGINS IN JUNE

ANNUAL PICNIC SLATED JUNE 18

The USI Alumni Association's annual picnic will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. Friday, June 18, on the front lawn, coinciding with the opening of the Evansville Freedom Festival hot-air balloon events.

Faculty chefs will prepare hamburgers and hot dogs with all the fixings. There will be games and activities for the kids and a free gift for all attending. Admission is \$2 for adults, 50 cents for children. Reservations are due by Friday, June 14, and are required to receive advance picnic/parking ID; call extension 1924 for information.

Hot-air balloon events on the USI campus start at dusk (about 9 p.m.) June 18, with the annual Balloon Glow. A Freedom Festival button is required for admission to the glow and to balloon events on Saturday -- the Key Grab at 6:45 a.m., and the Hare & Hound Race at 6 p.m.

USI LICENSE PLATE

The minimum order of 200 USI license plates remains in effect if the University is to remain in the Indiana Department of Motor Vehicles' specialized plate program for the second year.

August 15 is the deadline for the Alumni Affairs office to chalk up 200 applicants and continue offering the USI plates. A \$25 tax-deductible contribution is required when ordering or renewing your plate. Call Alumni Affairs, extension 1924, for information or to request a plate application form.

An official plate certificate will be mailed in December, to be presented to the license branch office to obtain plates, starting in January 1994. A \$10 per-plate processing fee will be charged at that time, in addition to regular plate fees.
