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WELCOME TO NEW ISUE STAFF MEMBERS. A new administrator and two new faculty members joined the ISUE staff this spring semester. They are Delbert Clayton, Robert W. Hooper, and Steven Read.

Delbert Clayton, a native of Tennessee, accepted a position as assistant professor of business. Clayton came to ISUE from Jackson State Community College in Jackson, Tennessee. He earned a B.A. degree at the David Lipscomb College in 1960 and an M.B.A. from Murray State University in 1976.

Accepting the position of director and instructor in respiratory therapy was Robert W. Hooper. He completed the Deaconess Hospital Inhalation Therapy School in 1969 and earned an A.S. degree in 1975 from ISUE. Before joining the ISUE staff, Hooper worked as a clinical instructor at Deaconess Hospital.

Steven Read accepted the position of academic systems analyst in the University's computer center. Read graduated from Indiana State University - Terre Haute in 1981 with a B.S. degree in computer science. While attending ISU, he served as a consultant in the ISU computer center and as a programmer/consultant for the chemical engineering department.

NONCREDIT COURSES TO BEGIN SOON. Many of ISUE's spring noncredit courses begin during the months of January and February. The courses are sponsored by the Office of Continuing Education and are designed to provide opportunities for personal growth and development.

More than 90 courses are offered this spring including several new courses. The new liberal arts courses are "German American Heritage" taught by Dr. Darrel Bigham, professor of history; "Oral History" taught by Dr. Glenda Morrison, regional director of the Indiana Labor History Project; and "Beginning Chinese" taught by Ms. Peiyu Wu, a native of China.

The new professional and career development courses include "Labor-Management Relations" taught by Mr. James Coy, executive vice president and director of sales for Lewis Brothers Bakeries; "Communication Supervision" taught by Dr. Sherry Darrell, ISUE assistant professor of English; "Look Right-Dress Right-Feel Right" taught by Ms. Joanne Reid, supervisor of home economics for the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation; "Considering Career Change--Choice, Challenge, Commitment" taught by Ms. Laura Hubbell, publications editor for Whirlpool Corporation; "Basic Chemistry" taught by Drs. Howard Dunn and Andrew Jorgensen, professor and associate professor of chemistry; and "Technical Writing" taught by Dr. John Martin, lecturer in English.

The new noncredit physical activity courses are "Fitness and Weight Training" taught by Mr. Chris Phillips of the Tri-State Racquet Club; "Pre-School Swim and Gym" taught by Mr. Paul Krack, ISUE recreational sports coordinator; and "Competitive Swim Clinic" also taught by Mr. Krack.

Noncredit parenting courses are "Parenting the Gifted and Talented Child" taught by Ms. Pat McReynolds, coordinator of the gifted and talented program at ISUE; and "Building Self-Esteem in Children and Teenagers" taught by Ms. Connie Davis-Oldham, social worker for the Southwestern Indiana Mental Health Center.

The new personal interest courses are "Creative Cookery with Herbs" taught by Ms. Berta Smith, owner of Harmony Herbs, "Culinary Tour of the Mediterranean" taught by Mr. John Oldham, amateur gourmet; and "Beginning Basketry" taught by Ms. Linda Van Alstyne, a member of the Riverbend Spinning and Weaving Guild.

Other popular noncredit courses offered by the Office of Continuing Education in the past will be repeated this spring. These courses are in the fields of professional and career development, women's interest, fitness, aquatics, gymnastics, and personal money management.
