Up to 250 juniors and seniors from 16 southern Indiana high schools are expected to attend the 1992 Indiana State Mathematics Contest at the University of Southern Indiana, one of 14 sites for the statewide competition.

The April 25 contest is open to all students in algebra I and II, geometry, or comprehensive mathematics courses. Scholars Certificates are awarded to top local scorers and Outstanding Scholars Certificates are awarded to top state scorers, who also will be recognized at an awards ceremony in Indianapolis.

At USI, the students also will have an opportunity to enter the Math-O-Rama, a round-robin tournament in which they pair off to attack a series of recreational math problems. The USI contest was started in 1975 by Dr. Victoria Pohl, USI professor of mathematics, and later was merged with the state contest, sponsored since 1983 by the Indiana Council of Teachers of Mathematics.

Dr. David W. Kinsey, USI associate professor of mathematics, is directing the state portion of the contest which starts at 9:30 a.m. in Forum I. Dr. Pohl is in charge of the USI competition at 11:15 a.m. in Forum II. The awards ceremony will be held at 1:15 p.m. in Forum II.
