USI IN NEW MIDWEST SPEAKERS DIRECTORY. The University is included in a new Speakers Directory published by the Committee on Entrance Services of the Midwestern Regional Assembly of the College Board for the benefit of high school guidance counselors and college-bound students. Designed to assist in the school-to-college transition, the directory lists persons from colleges and universities in Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, West Virginia, and Wisconsin, who will speak on "Preparation for College," "The College Selection Process," "Financial Aid," "The Application Process," and "Career Opportunities for College Graduates." The directory, which will be distributed to all Midwest high schools, lists **Mr. Timothy Buecher**, director of Admissions, and **Mr. James Patton**, director of Financial Aids, as the USI representatives.

HANDS ACROSS THE WEST SIDE. Individuals and groups are being asked to participate Sunday, June 1, in a "Hands Across the West Side" fundraiser to benefit needy West Side children. The event is being organized by the West Side Business and Professional Association. The line is scheduled to form at 5:30 p.m. and it is hoped it will stretch the three and one-half miles from the city limits on Harmony Way to near Main Street on the downtown riverfront. Participants are asked to donate \$1 each to stand in line. They will join hands at 5:59 p.m. and at that point, four USI cross-country runners will jog along the course to collect additional donations. Funds collected will be allocated after consultation with school officials and charitable organizations. SCULPTORS FEATURED AT NEW HARMONY. Two emerging Tri-State sculptors -- **Mr. Chet Geiselman**, a USI graduate, and **Mr. John Pohlman** -- will be featured in an exhibition June 1-30 at the New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art. They will be guests for a reception from 1 to 5 p.m. Sunday, opening the exhibition. The gallery is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday, and 1 to 5 p.m. Sunday.

Mr. Geiselman, a native of Elberfeld, Indiana, who now lives at Carbondale, Illinois, will exhibit recent fabrications in steel, wood, and concrete. His newest work fuses architectonic forms with flowing organic shapes. Mr. Pohlman, now of St. Louis, is a graduate of Webster College and Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville. His latest pedestal and wall pieces utilize clay, wood, wire, and screen with bright glazes and paint. Much of the work has a foundation in functional ceramic ware but quickly goes beyond into fantasy.

Thursday, May 29, is the final day at the New Harmony gallery for "Peers Appear," an exhibition of work by **Mr. Leonard Dowhie**, USI associate professor of art; **Mr. John McNaughton**, USI professor of art; and two of their students, **Ms. Nancy Burch** and **Ms. Nelia Kimbrough**, now co-owners of the Parrett Street Gallery in Evansville.

In addition, Harmonie State Park and swimming pool on Indiana 69 four miles south of New Harmony has opened for the summer.
