FIRST CAPPING CEREMONY SET FOR JANUARY 30, 1972

Dr. Maynard K. Hine, Chancellor of Indiana University-Purdue University at Indianapolis, will be the guest speaker at the first capping ceremony for the dental hygiene students at Indiana State University, Evansville. The ceremony will be held on January 30 at the Evansville Campus. Twelve students will be capped.

Dr. Hine, former dean of the Indiana University School of Dentistry, has served as the IU-PUI chancellor for the past three years.

Dr. Hine was the editor of the Journal of Periodontology from 1950 through 1970, and has co-authored five books, Periodontia; Preventive Dentistry; Symposium on Preventive Dentistry; Textbook of Oral Pathology; and Review of Dentistry.

At the present Dr. Hine is a member of the Advisory Committee on Dental Health of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and active on various committees of the Federation Dentaire Internationale.

WAIVER OF FEES FOR STAFF

The Indiana State University Board of Trustees, at their meeting held on September 20, 1968, authorized the waiver of contingent and student service fees for faculty members enrolling in classes at Indiana State University. The policy applies to all full-time faculty, including one-year appointees; the original authorization which permitted a faculty member to enroll in not more than six semester hours per academic year was amended on May 15, 1971, to permit a faculty member, under certain conditions, to enroll with fee waiver in not more than six hours per calendar year.

January 19, 1972

On December 18, 1971, the Indiana State University Board of Trustees, pursuant to the recommendation of President Rankin, revised the policy to include waiver of contingent and student service fees (does not include building facility fee) for all University full-time staff subject to the restrictions set forth in the University Handbook. The waiver of fee provision is not retroactive and will be effective with the beginning of the Second Semester, 1972. (For further information and fee waiver forms, contact Mr. Elmer Sander in Financial Aids Office.) This policy does not apply to non-credit or extended services classes.
