Program to recognize best in work-site wellness efforts

USI is beginning a Health Promotion Awards Program to recognize individuals, businesses, and organizations for excellence in work-site health promotion programs. The awards focus on the quality of the program, the impact it has on program participants, and the benefits of the program to the organization it serves. Applications are being accepted through August 20 and the award winners will be announced at the health promotion conference on September 23 at USI. Applicants must complete a 1999 Health Promotion Awards application form available from the USI School of Nursing and Health Professions, sponsor of the awards program.

Ms. Judi Kuric, award program organizer and USI lecturer in nursing and health professions, said, "Applications will be evaluated on appropriateness of the services provided, the participation level, the program effectiveness, and evidence of quality improvement efforts. Programs may take the shape of awareness education, chronic disease management, health screenings, exercise and fitness, work-site safety and injury prevention, work and family, organization support, or other activities.

Both non-profit and for-profit organizations are eligible to enter the competition. Organizations are grouped by number of persons eligible for participation. The groupings are up to 50 persons eligible, between 50 and 500 persons eligible, and over 500 persons eligible.

Guidelines for the awards program were adapted from the Association for Worksite Health Promotion (AWHP), of which USI is a member. Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee composed of Dr. Nadine Coudret, dean of the School of Nursing and Health Professions; Ms. Judy Kuric; Ms. Lisa Gish, executive director, Tri-State Business Group on Health; Mr. Tim Mahoney, coordinator, Southern Indiana Labor Management Forum; and Ms. Christina Beaudoin, assistant professor of physical education.

Organizations throughout the tri-state area are eligible to enter the competition.

Summer fitness program

The USI Fitness Center will hold "Keeping Your Insides Alive," a program open to faculty, staff, and students and developed to promote cross-training, increase variety in working-out, and to improve overall fitness. The sixweek program will be held Friday, July 9 - Friday, August 20.

Participants will be asked to exercise twice per week. Each session must consist of at least 20 minutes of cardiovascular exercise and 10 minutes of strength conditioning. At the end of the program, participants who have completed 20 exercise sessions will receive a tank-top. Eight group exercise sessions will be offered during the program that will enable participants to win a bonus prize.

Computer password solution

Since Outlook was installed on USI computers, there has been confusion about passwords. Each user has two passwords - a Novell/UCS password and a Microsoft Networking/Outlook password. Outlook requires that the Outlook password and the UCS password be the same. Understandably, people are having trouble keeping passwords synchronized.

Novell networking software requires the password be changed every 60 days. It is recommended that when changing the Novell password, also change the Outlook password to match.

The way to change a password varies depending on the operating system in use. When Novell or Microsoft networking lets you know that the password is about to expire, sign-on with your current ID and password. Then follow the appropriate directions below to change both passwords.

If you use Windows 95 or 98 - Click Start, Settings, Control Panel, Passwords, Change Other Passwords, Highlight Microsoft Networking, click Change, enter Old/New/Confirm passwords and enter. Follow the same directions for the Novell password, highlighting Novell.

If you use Windows NT - After successful logon, press Ctl-Alt-Del, there should be a change password option. USI and USI_Main should be highlighted. Enter Old/New/Confirm passwords and enter.
