1992-93 MEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

With new Head Coach Bruce Pearl at the helm, the fans of the University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles will be seeing a different style of basketball this season.

At his first press conference on May 4, Pearl told a crowded room, "We bring a fast-breaking, pressure defensive style of basketball to USI. For 14 years, I've worked with one of the premier teachers in college basketball, Dr. Tom Davis. We'll soon see just how good a student I was."

The energy and enthusiasm Bruce Pearl brings will be needed as the Eagles try to turn around the 10-18 overall record, 4-14 Great Lakes Valley Conference record. USI finished tied for eighth-place.

"I recognize the problems, view them as opportunities and I accept the challenge. This program has had success and we will build on that tradition. We would like to create an atmosphere in the PAC that is exciting to the fans and intimidating to the opponents," said Pearl.

For the Eagles to fly back into the upper division of the GLVC this season, they will depend on 6-10 senior forward Chris Bowles. Bowles, who was honorable mention All-American and first team All-GLVC for the second straight year in 1991-92, led the conference in rebounding (10.9 rpg) and was second in scoring (19.6 ppg). He led the Eagles in scoring in 19 games and in rebounding in 23 games. The 19.6 ppg statistic ranked 59th nationally, while the 10.9 rpg statistic ranked ninth nationally.

Bowles, who may be one of the most dangerous big men in the GLVC, may see more time at forward than center this season. Pearl said, "I believe you use a player at his best position. Our power forward must be someone who can face the basket, shoot the three point field goal, as well as rebound and score inside. Bowles has the qualities to become a fine power forward, perhaps as good as any I have coached."

The move of Bowles to the forward position will leave the center spot wide open. Duron Hebron, a 6-7 senior, is a leading candidate. He started 1991-92 slowly following emergency surgery, but exploded in the final nine games, averaging 13.1 ppg and 7.7 rpg. On the season, Hebron averaged 8.6 ppg and 5.6 rpg. "I look for Hebron to have a great senior year," said Pearl.

Hebron also shot well from the field, hitting 58.2 percent of his shots (106-182), a statistic which gave him an 11th ranking in the GLVC.

Returning with Bowles and Hebron in the frontcourt is 6-7 junior forward Todd Jones, 6-8 senior center Troy Tornatta, and 6-8 freshman forward Neil Coyle.

Jones, who transferred to USI from Ball State University in 1991-92, played in all 28 games, starting the last 11 of 12. He averaged 6.0 ppg and 2.7 rpg and hit 19 three-point field goals. Pearl said, "We'll be counting on Todd's experience and leadership."

Tornatta, who transferred to USI from Wabash Valley College, gave USI some valuable minutes during the conference season in rebounding and banging in the post. He played in 17 games and averaged 1.1 ppg and 1.2 rpg. "Tornatta may be counted on more heavily; this his senior season," said Pearl.

Redshirted after he broke his foot in the third game of last season, Coyle will begin his freshman basketball season over in 1992-93. Before the injury, Coyle was averaging 9.7 ppg and 6.0 rpg. Pearl said, "His aggressive play should fit the new system as the frontline players compete for playing time."

"One of my concerns with this ball club is our lack of depth on the inside. This could have a negative effect on our ability to rebound and score in the paint if we get into foul trouble and have to go to a smaller lineup."

Leading the way for the Eagles in the USI backcourt is 6-2 junior guard Craig Martin. Martin, a 4.0 presidential scholar, was honorable mention All-GLVC and Academic All-GLVC last season, averaged 14.7 ppg and 5.6 assists per game.

As teams started to key on Bowles, Martin came alive from the outside. In the second half of the season, Martin average 17.7 ppg and 6.6 apg, including a 30 point and 10 assist effort versus Northern Kentucky University. "Craig is a role model for all student-athletes," said Pearl. "USI is very proud of Craig Martin."

Two sophomores, 6-2 Torrence Eddie and 6-1 Mike Allen, will again compete with Martin in the backcourt. Eddie started all but one game last season and averaged 9.8 ppg, 2.9 rpg, and 2.4 apg. Allen, a transfer from Western Illinois University, battled through the season with a knee injury. He played in 26 games and averaged 1.5 ppg. Pearl said, "Torrence really benefitted from all that playing time last season, while Mike never got healthy. I look for them to challenge."

Splitting time between the guard and forward position is 6-5 junior Jeff Doyle. Doyle played in 28 games, started 15, and averaged 5.4 ppg and 3.3 rpg. Doyle began the 1991-92 season on fire and was named to the Kenny Kent Toyota Classic All-Tournament team. Pearl said, "I hope Jeff can maintain the level of confidence he showed early in the year."


The Eagles have signed three new players.

Tyrone Tate has transferred to USI after starting at point guard for the past two years at the University of Utah. He is a 6-0 junior guard, who averaged 4.8 ppg, 2.2 rpg, and led Utah in assists with 3.0 apg. Tate started 64 of 66 games, leading the Utes to 30 wins as a freshman and participated in the Final Four of the NIT last year. "We are very fortunate to have attracted a player as solid as Tyrone. I have watched Tyrone play for the last five years in high school and college and I am delighted to have the opportunity to coach him," said Pearl.

Signing as freshmen are 6-2 guard Shawn Aldridge from Chicago Heights, Ill., and Scott Taylor, a 6-4 forward from East Moline, Ill. Aldridge played for power house Bloom Trail High School, where he was the all-time career scoring leader (1,260 points, 16.5 ppg), and second in career rebounding leader (595 rebounds, 7.8 rpg). Taylor was the Quad-City Player-of-the-Year, and averaged 18.0 ppg and 10.7 rpg at United Township High School. Pearl said, "Although it is unusual for freshman to play key roles in the GLVC, both have the talent to contribute. We have three fine young gentlemen in Scott, Shawn, and Tyrone, who exemplify the type of student-athlete we want to recruit."

"I am pleased with our depth at the guard positions. This should enable us to press, fast break and beat our opponents down the floor. Our backcourt has the skills to handle the ball, shoot the three and create off the dribble."

"Expectations are high and anticipation for the start of the season is great. We may not be the most talented team yet, but we will play hard every night," promised USI's Head Coach.

HEAD COACH BRUCE PEARL

Bruce Pearl begins his initial season as a head basketball coach and his first year at USI. At 32, Pearl is considered by many to be one of the bright young coaches in the nation.


Last season, Pearl was an assistant coach at the University of Iowa in Iowa City, where he was responsible for implementing full-court pressure defensive tactics. He was also responsible for the performance of Iowa's inside players, particularly the offensive and defensive post players. Coach Pearl has been given considerable credit for the success of current pro basketball players Brad Lohaus (Milwaukee Bucks), Les Jepsen (Sacramento Kings) and future NBA star Acie Earl.

During Pearl's six-year stay at Iowa, the Hawkeyes received five tournament berths, one final eight appearance (1987), one final 16 appearance (1988), and placed eight players in the National Basketball Association. While at Iowa, Pearl helped head coach, Dr. Tom Davis, to a 129-63 record. For his efforts in 1988, Pearl was recognized as one of the top Division I assistants in the country by Basketball Weekly.

In leaving Iowa, Pearl ends 14 years as an assistant and right-hand man to Dr. Davis. Prior to joining Davis at Iowa, Pearl was his assistant coach (1982-83) and an associate head coach (1983-86) at Stanford University. As an undergraduate, Pearl was his administrative assistant at Boston College (1978-82).

Pearl received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Boston College in 1982, graduating cum laude. He will receive his master's degree in education administration from Iowa this year.


Pearl and his wife, Kim, have two beautiful children, a daughter, Jacqui and a son, Steven.







Beginning his first year at USI, Rick Herdes joins Coach Pearl as his top assistant coach.

Herdes comes to USI from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he was an assistant from 1986 to 1992. While at SIUE, Herdes helped Head Coach Larry Graham lead the Cougars to a 127-56 record and three national tournament appearances. He was responsible for coordinating on- and off-campus recruiting and considered to be one of the top recruiters in Division II. He also was academic advisor to the basketball team and director of summer camps and fund-raising events.


During his time at SIUE, he was the head coach for the Illinois Prairie State Games, Southern Open Men's Division in 1991 and 1992. His 1992 team received the silver medal.

Prior to working at SIUE, Herdes was an assistant basketball coach and physical education instructor at Lawrenceville (IL) High School, where he worked for current Indiana University assistant coach Ron Felling. LHS was the Illinois Class A State Champion in 1982 and 1983 and had a 68 game winning streak.

Herdes graduated from Graceland College in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in education and is completing a graduate program in secondary education at USI.

As a player, Herdes led Lincoln Trail to a ninth-place finish in the national tournament and helped lead Graceland to its first-ever appearance in the NAIA Tournament.

Herdes and his wife, Lisa, have a daughter, Taylor.



ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA



The University of Southern Indiana endeavors to improve access to higher education and to serve the economic, intellectual, and cultural needs of southern Indiana. Established in 1965, the University of Southern Indiana serves over 7,000 students, of which 90 per cent are from Indiana.

USI is located seven miles west of downtown Evansville. The natural beauty of the University is a significant feature of the campus. Located on 300 acres of gently rolling hills, the University has six main buildings. Construction of a Health Professions Building is to be completed in 1994.

Academic programs in over 60 majors are offered in the School of Business, the School of Education and Human Services, the School of Liberal Arts, the School of Science and Engineering Technology, and the School of Nursing and Health Professions.

The University of Southern Indiana grants Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Occupational and General Studies (G.S.), Bachelor of Science (B.S.), Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.), and Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) degrees at the undergraduate level. Several of the schools offer associate degrees for two or three years of full-time study. Graduate students may work toward a master's degree in business administration, education, industrial management, or liberal studies.

Through the Office of Continuing Education, USI offers seminars, workshops, short courses, and customized and in-house programs. The topic range includes business/professional development, Total Quality Management, fitness/wellness/recreation, arts and leisure, personal interest, programs for children, and travel/study programs.

Located within walking and biking distance to the campus, the Mid America Student Housing (MASH) units and Campus Apartments are home to over 1,200 students at USI.

USI sponsors 11 intercollegiate sports—men's baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, and tennis and women's basketball, softball, cross country, volleyball, and tennis—in the Great Lakes Valley Conference of NCAA Division II competition. The soccer program is independent in NCAA Division I.
