About the University of Southern Indiana

Location. Founded in 1965, the University of Southern Indiana is located in Evansville, the state's third largest city. From its picturesque site on the Ohio River, Evansville is a comfortable drive from major metropolitan areas such as Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

Academic Life. The University enrolls over 8,415 students and offers majors in 60 areas of study. Several graduate degree programs also are available.

Campus Life. Beyond the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 80 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the student to enjoy and contribute to campus life.

Residence Life. Student housing at USI is apartment-style. Residents share an air-conditioned furnished apartment with kitchen, dining area, living room, two bedrooms, and two bathrooms. On-site facilities such as computer labs, laundromats, convenience store, outdoor recreational areas, and a student lounge contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven overwhelmingly popular with students. An enclosed suite-style residence hall is scheduled to open in 1999 and will offer students a new choice in residence life.

Financial Assistance. Since USI is the most affordable four-year institution in the state of Indiana, many families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial aid. Many others qualify for need-based financial aid packages, including grants, loans, and jobs.

USI Softball 1999 Outlook

The cards have been dealt for the 1999 softball season and the University of Southern Indiana is holding a full-house, including two aces. There will be no bluffing the expectations with an All-American selection, an All-Region selection, and five All-GLVC performers returning.

The Eagles finished the 1998 season with an overall record of 48-17 (22-6 in Great Lakes Valley Conference play), captured their third GLVC crown in six seasons, and advanced to the NCAA II Regionals. With the loss of only two seniors, the squad expects to improve on last season's success.

Dealing out the line-up cards will be fourth-year Head Coach Beth Watson. The 1998 Great Lakes Valley Conference Coach of the Year guided the Eagles to a school record 48 victories last season. Her three seasons at USI has resulted in a record of 100-65.

The anticipated success begins with the return of USI's two pitchers. Senior Amy Stetler (Lafayette, IN), a two-time All-GLVC first team selection, posted a 25-10 record and 1.22 ERA in 1998. Her 25 victories placed her 11th nationally among pitching wins. One of the best pitchers in USI history, Stetler holds USI career records for innings pitched, complete games, shutouts, and wins. Her 349 career strikeouts are only 66 behind the all-time record at USI.

Sharing the pitching duties with Stetler will be sophomore Katie Roberts (Lafayette, IN). Roberts turned in a freshman campaign of 21-7 and a 1.45 ERA, throwing a no-hitter in only her third collegiate start. She also compiled 86.3 consecutive scoreless innings on her way to being named second team All-GLVC.

Roberts lead the Eagles to their only NCAA tournament win last season, a 2-1 victory over Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville.

Stetler and Roberts combined for an overall ERA of 1.43, which ranked USI 20th in the NCAA.

"Our pitching staff is certainly going to play a major role," says Watson. "Most coaches feel confident with one strong pitcher, so for us to have two is a huge boost."

If opponents are able to get a bat on the ball, a solid veteran infield will provide a defense which ranked first in Division II with a fielding percentage of .977. Coach Watson expects the Eagles to maintain that level.

"We have two of the best middle infielders (second base and shortstop) in the region, if not the country," comments Watson. "With that experience, our defense should continue to be one of the best in Division II."

Returning at second base is first team All-American **Trisha Poling** (Newburgh, IN). Poling hit a team-best .451 last season and set a school record for hits in a season, with 87. After only two seasons, she ranks fourth all-time in career runs scored and stolen bases; she also ranks third all-time in career hits at USI. In addition to being named All-American, Poling also was named first team All-GLVC, first team All-Region, and Academic All-Conference in 1998.

Joining Poling in the middle of the infield is senior shortstop **Toni Brannon** (Connersville, IN). Brannon hit a career-high .323 last season and had a fielding percentage of .946 while being named Academic All-GLVC.

Contesting for the remaining infield positions will be junior college transfer **Brenna Foutz** (Princeton, IN) and two freshmen. Foutz joins the Eagle squad after playing two years at Wabash Valley Junior College, where she was a key element in their fifth-place finish at the national finals last season. **Natalie Dietrich** (West Lafayette, IN) and **Molly Blackford** (Newburgh, IN) also expect to see action on the infield.

The outfield returns an All-Region selection in sophomore **Nicole Vine** (Whiting, IN). Vine was named to the second team All-Region as well as second team All-GLVC and Academic All-GLVC after hitting .341 during her freshman season. She also committed only one error in 36 games in the outfield for a .990 fielding percentage.

Alongside Vine in the outfield is junior rightfielder **Andrea Strange** (Montgomery, IN), who committed only three errors and had a .973 field percentage last season. Strange was awarded a spot on the All-GLVC second team after hitting .314 last season with a team-high 11 doubles.

"Nicole and Andrea do an excellent job of covering the outfield," said Watson. "They both have excellent speed and strong arms, so we won't see many balls get to the fence."

Coach Watson will have three options for the final outfield slot. Sophomore **Julie Hooper** (Ft. Wayne, IN), who played in 18 games last season and hit .276, is a top candidate; freshmen **Janet Maynard** (Milford, OH) and **Jamie Kennedy** (Evansville, IN) also are expected to see action on the field.

Junior catchers **Crystal Virgin** (Lafayette, IN) and **Jennifer Smith** (Logansport, IN) return for a third season as the USI back stops. Virgin started in 49 games last season and caught both of the Eagles' no-hitters. Smith started 20 games last season, hit for a .341 average, and committed only one error for a .990 fielding average.

Backing up Virgin and Smith behind the plate is **Michelle Stetler** (Lafayette, IN). Stetler, sister of Eagles' pitcher Amy Stetler, played catcher without an error for two consecutive seasons (1997 and 1998) while at Lafayette Harrison High School.

USI faces one of its toughest schedules ever in 1999. The Eagles start the season against NCAA Regional participant North Dakota State, who posted a 64-17 record last season. USI then hosts the annual USI Reebok Spring Classic, featuring North Dakota State, Great Lakes Regional participant Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville (36-23 last season), and Great Lakes Regional champion and NCAA Division II third-place team Ferris State University (44-16). USI also plays in the Queens College Invitational, a tournament spotlighting seven 1998 NCAA tournament teams. At the Kennesaw State Tournament, the Eagles may face three additional 1998 NCAA tournament teams, including 1997 NCAA Division II champion Kennesaw State. USI also has two other NCAA tournament teams on their regular season schedule, Columbus State and Ashland, as well as the always-tough GLVC conference schedule.

Softball Head Coach Beth Watson

University of Southern Indiana Softball Head Coach Beth Watson is in her third season at the helm of the USI women's softball team. In addition to her softball duties, Watson is an instructor in the Physical Education Department. In seven seasons as a head coach, Watson has a career mark of 199-136 (.594)

In 1998, Watson was named the Great Lakes Valley Conference Coach of the Year after leading USI to its third GLVC Championship since 1993. Watson's Eagles were 48-17 overall, 22-6 GLVC, and finished second in the GLVC's Southwest Division. In three seasons with USI, Watson has a record of 100-65 (.606).

During her second season, Watson led USI back to the .500 mark for the third time in the last four seasons, bringing the team to a 30-26 overall record, 13-9 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. With the 30 wins, Watson moved into third place all-time at USI in career wins and has a 52-48 record in two seasons.

In her first season at USI, Watson led the Eagles to a 22-22 overall record and a fourth place finish in the GLVC with a 10-8 record.

Watson came to USI from Southwest Missouri State University in Springfield, Mo., where she was the restricted earnings assistant coach and a graduate assistant from 1992 to 1994. At SMSU, Watson was the first base/outfield coach and travel coordinator, and assisted in recruiting. She also directed field maintenance; coordinated pitching, catching, and hitting clinics; and coordinated the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament.

Prior to her tenure at SMSU, Watson was the head softball coach for Friends University (Wichita, KN) from 1989 to 1992. In four seasons at Friends, Watson guided the program to two regular season Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference titles, one KCAC tournament championship, and had an overall record of 102-73. She was named the KCAC Coach of the Year in 1989.

Watson graduated from Friends University with a Bachelor's in Health and Physical Education in 1989 and from SMSU with a Master's in Educational Administration in 1995. As an undergraduate at Friends, she was named All-Conference, All-District, and Most Valuable Player three straight seasons in softball (1985-88) and two straight seasons in volleyball (1987-88). She also was named NAIA Academic All-American in softball and volleyball in two straight seasons (1986-88).

Softball Assistant Coach Danielle Daniel

Danielle Daniel enters her second season as assistant coach of the University of Southern Indiana softball team. Working mainly with the outfielders, Daniel helped lead the Screaming Eagles to a 48-17 overall record, including a .970 fielding percentage for the outfielders.

Daniel, a graduate of Evansville Central High School, was a four-year letter winner on the Lady Eagle softball squad. After hitting for a .245 average and converting on .926 percent of her fielding chances during her injury-plagued senior season, she was named to the Great Lakes Valley All-Conference team. For her career, Daniel hit for a .272 batting average and maintained a .946 fielding percentage.

Daniel completed her bachelor's of arts degree in secondary education in the spring of 1998. She is currently working toward a master's of arts degree in education.
