ALUMNUS' NOVEL PUBLISHED. Keith Rice, a 1972 political science graduate of Indiana State University Evansville, is the author of Out of Canaan, a novel that was published March 31 by Charles Scribner's Sons of New York. According to advanced reviews, the novel reflects an emerging talent of great potential.

Out of Canaan is about an afternoon in 1963 when some grandparents tell their grandson a story out of their own family history that goes back to 1890. Publishers Weekly says that this first novel is imbued with the heritage of southern letters. The reader gets an intensely studied picture of the life, times, dress and speech of the east central Kentucky region. "Certainly, this novel is far above the level of most first novels, and indeed superior to that of many writers' subsequent efforts," stated Bill Greer of the Sunday Courier and Press.
