## Jon Mark Hall, Director of Athletics



Jon Mark Hall was appointed to the position of director of Athletics in January 2002, after seven years as the assistant director of Athletics.

Under his direction, USI was the 2003-04 GLVC All-Sports and Commissioner's Cup winner and host of the 2004 NCAA Division II Cross Country National Championships.

In addition to his duties as director of Athletics, Hall also is the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's tennis committee. He has served on the Great Lakes Valley Conference Executive Committee and the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional women's basketball committee.

Hall joined the USI Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach.

As the men's tennis coach, no one did it better in the GLVC than Hall. He was named the GLVC Coach of the Year five times, directed the Screaming Eagles to four GLVC regular-season titles and GLVC Tournament crowns, and had a 123-47 record (.724).

During his final season as head coach, Hall led the Eagles to their third straight appearance in the NCAA II Tournament and their first victory

in the post-season. In 2000 and 2001, Hall put the Eagles on the national map with their first two invitations to the NCAA II Tournament in the 27-year history of the program.

Hall came to USI after his appointment at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fundraising and promotional activities.

The native of Murray, Kentucky, is a 1990 *cum laude* graduate of Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

In 1998-99, he completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program at the University of South Carolina and the University of Notre Dame.

Hall and his wife Patti reside in Evansville and have four sons, Nathan, Garland, Ty, and Owen, and daughter, Mary Claire.

USI is a vibrant campus with modern facilities and an exciting pace of growth. Since the first campus building (Wright Administration Building) opened in 1969, the face of the campus has continued to change, providing the most up-to-date facilities for academics, housing, and student life. Facility development at USI keeps students and faculty equipped with the resources they need, including the best in advanced teaching and learning technology for classrooms and laboratories.

### Computer Services

Computer labs are located throughout campus and in the housing areas. Wireless service is available in all main buildings and the surrounding courtyards.

All residence life areas are equipped with network jacks for Internet access. Wireless network also is available throughout the housing areas.

### **Location**

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

### **The Campus**

The Nursing and Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, the Education Center, and the Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, the University Center, the Liberal Arts Center, the Technology Center, and the Business and Engineering Center, now under construction, form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation and Fitness Center, which is undergoing a substantial addition, are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,700 students who live on campus.

### **Academic Life**

The University enrolls 10,126 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

### **Campus Life**

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.



### **Residence Life**

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suite-style housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular to students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

### **Financial Assistance**

USI provides families with an affordable way to higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.

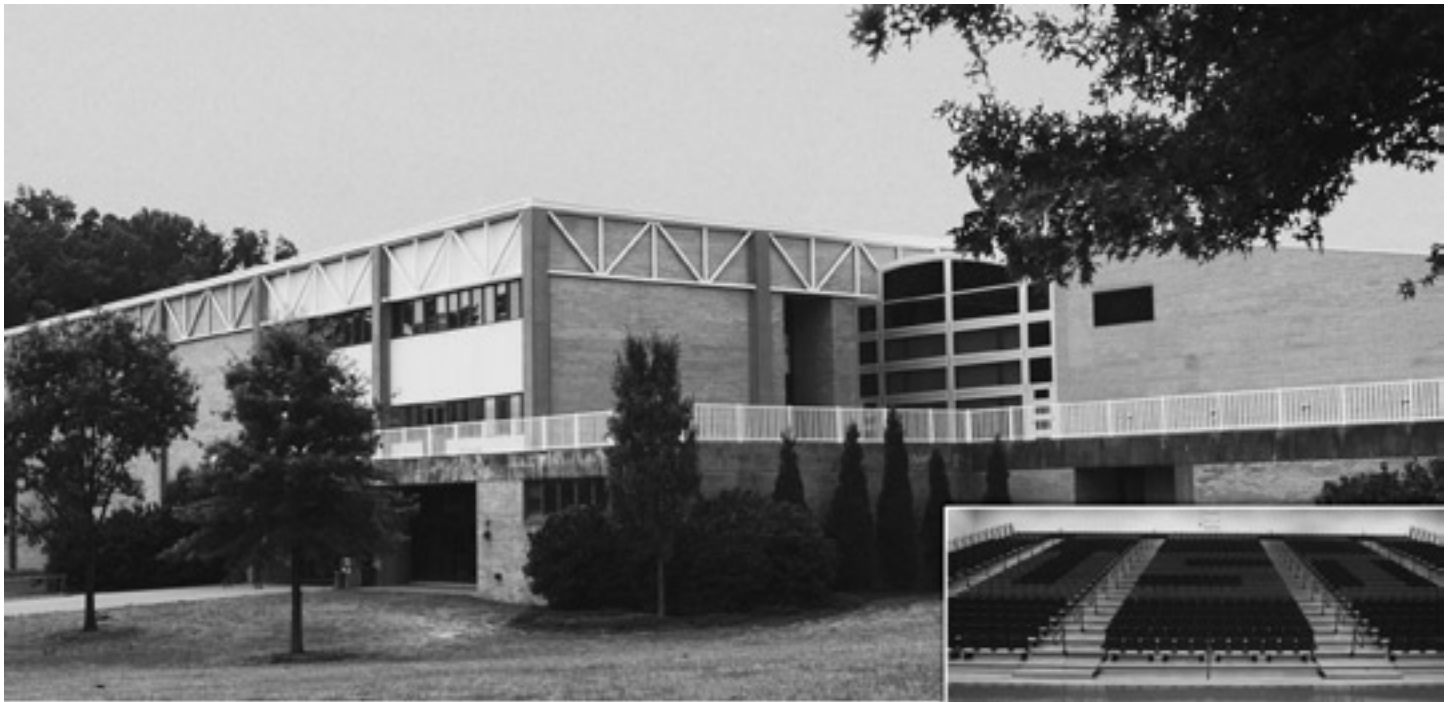

## **Physical Activities Center**

The newly renovated Physical Activities Center (PAC) has been the home of the Screaming Eagles for the past 28 years. Opened in 1980, the PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, and is the arena for the USI basketball and volleyball teams.

The center court of the PAC has been the setting for many games of regional and national interest during the past 13 years. USI has hosted the 1993, 1994, and 1996 men's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; the 1998 women's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 and 2001 women's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; and the 2000 and 2004 GLVC Volleyball Tournaments.

A true home court, the USI women's basketball team has a 174-60 home record since 1993-94, a .744 winning percentage.

In 2006-07, the PAC underwent renovations that included three new wood courts and a new center-court design that incorporated USI's athletic logo. The renovation also featured a new scoreboard and video board, new portable goals, and new seating. Among the changes to the seating were padded chairback seats and back-supported bleacher seats.

Situated on the banks of the Ohio River, Evansville is a mid-sized city that welcomes USI students and offers them plenty of things to do. Roberts Stadium and the Victory Theatre attract students to concerts by entertainers like Nelly, Aerosmith, Kenny Chesney, Kid Rock, and Josh Groban. Traveling Broadway shows and feature performances come to The Centre. For a relaxing walk or invigorating run, the downtown riverfront features a greenway with a wonderful view of the changing river traffic and the Evansville skyline. Movie theatres (including an IMAX) and Swonder Ice Arena draw students together for fun, activity, and fellowship. ## Eagles eyeing rise to GLVC supremacy

The University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team is looking to climb the ladder in the Great Lakes Valley Conference in 2008-09.

In one of the toughest conferences in Division II, the Screaming Eagles were one of the most competitive teams in the GLVC last year despite their 10-17 overall mark and 5-14 record in league play. USI held second-half leads in nearly every contest in a league that featured six NCAA II Tournament teams and the 2008 national champions.

Head Coach **Rick Stein**, who needs just seven wins to become the program's all-time winningest coach, has a solid group of returning players as well as a strong recruiting class to work with as he leads his program back into the national spotlight.

Stein is counting on his group of seniors—forward/centers **Ninette Evans**, **Jessica Grimaldo**, and **Brittany Neuman**—to provide solid leadership in 2008-09.

Evans is USI's top returning rebounder from a year ago after finishing 17th in the GLVC with 5.7 rebounds per game. She also scored in double figures four times and averaged 5.2 points per outing.

Neuman, who averaged 3.9 points per contest as a junior, also enjoyed a big year on the glass, finishing third on the team and 19th in GLVC with 5.6 rebounds per game.

Grimaldo provided a steady player off the bench for the Eagles last season, averaging 2.7 points and 2.4 rebounds per game.

Sophomore forward/center **Courtney Perry** and red-shirt freshman forward/center **Leigha Thompson** will help bolster USI's front court this season. Perry saw limited playing time in her first year with the Eagles, averaging 1.9 rebounds in 18 games, while Thompson, who was an All-State performer at Teutopolis High School (Teutopolis, Illinois), sat out the 2007-08 campaign due to injury.

Also look for freshman forward **Taylor Miller** to provide versatility to the Eagles' front court. Miller, a multi-sport star at Pendleton Heights High School (Pendleton, Indiana), was a two-time All-Conference and All-County performer after averaging nearly 10 points and more than five rebounds per game during her final two seasons.

USI's back court will be anchored by sophomore guards **Amie Newhart** and **Lauren Meneghetti**. Newhart started all 27 games

at the point guard position for the Eagles last season, averaging 9.8 points, 3.2 rebounds, and 2.6 assists per game. She ranked in the top 15 of three GLVC statistical categories, including steals (12th), three-point field goal percentage (15th), and minutes played (15th).

Meneghetti received valuable playing time during her first year in a USI uniform. She played in 24 games, averaging 3.6 points and 1.7 rebounds per contest, and had a season-high 12 points against GLVC champion Drury University.

To complement Newhart and Meneghetti in USI's back court, Stein used the recruiting trail to bring in an outstanding class of guards.

Junior guard/forward **Abby Williams** and sophomore guard **Ellen Young** bring collegiate experience to USI's roster after successful stints at their previous institutions.

Williams transferred to USI from Kankakee Community College where she was a two-time NJCAA Division II All-American. In 2007-08, Williams averaged 15.7 points and 6.8 rebounds per game and was named the Illinois Junior College Player of the Year while leading her squad to a 30-3 record and the national title game for the second straight season.



Sophomore guard Lauren Meneghetti (left) will bolster the Screaming Eagles' backcourt in 2008-09, while senior forward/centers Ninette Evans (middle) and Brittany Neuman (right) will be counted on to provide USI a physical presence in the paint. Meneghetti saw valuable playing time during her freshman season, while Evans and Neuman combined for more than 11 rebounds and nearly 10 points per game last year.

Young came to USI from Southern Illinois University Carbondale where she was named to the Missouri Valley Conference All-Freshman team after finishing third on the team and 13th in the league with 11.9 points per game last year. She scored in double figures 20 times as a freshman, including a season-high 26 points against Austin Peay.

Young, who was a three-time All-State performer at Salem Community High School (Salem, Illinois), averaged 25 points, 11.1 rebounds, and 4.5 steals per games as a senior in 2006-07.

In addition to Miller, Williams, and Young, Stein brought in three freshman guards—Rinesha Soaper, Cootie Leeberg, and Lauren Luce—that all have the opportunity to make an impact for the Eagles in 2008-09.

Soaper led Henderson County High School (Henderson, Kentucky) to a 24-5 record and the quarterfinals of the KHSAA Tournament as a senior in 2007-08. Soaper, who was the Kentucky Association of Basketball Coaches' Region II Player of the Year in 2008, averaged 19.2 points, 3.4 rebounds, and 4.1 assists per game as a senior to lead HCHS to the district championship and its fourth straight regional crown.

Leeberg graduated from Montini Catholic High School (Lombard, Illinois) where she averaged 6.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 2.3 assists per game. She helped guide MCHS

to a third-place finish in the 2008 IHSA Class 3A State Tournament and was part of four conference, sectional, and regional championship squads.

Luce graduated from South Knox High School (Vincennes, Indiana) where she competed in basketball, soccer, and track. She earned the Most Assist Award in basketball in 2005 and 2006 and was named to the Vincennes Sun Commercial All-Area team in soccer in 2006 and 2007.

USI begins its 2008-09 campaign November 1 with a trip to Bloomington, Indiana, and Assembly Hall for an exhibition game against Indiana University. The Eagles tip off the regular season November 15 against Abilene Christian University in the St. Edward's Shootout in Austin, Texas.

The Eagles open their 15-game home schedule a week later when they host Edinboro University at the Physical Activities Center. USI will entertain six non-conference opponents in addition to nine GLVC squads.

Among USI's GLVC opponents slated to visit the PAC is defending NCAA II champion Northern Kentucky University (January 8) and long-time rival Kentucky Wesleyan College (January 15). The Eagles, who open GLVC play at Lewis University December 4, also entertain 2007-08 NCAA II Tournament teams, the University of Indianapolis (January 4), Quincy University (February 5), Drury

University (February 7), and Missouri University of Science and Technology (February 21).

USI also takes on NCAA II Tournament participant Hillsdale College November 28 at the Indianapolis Classic as well as Bellarmine University January 10 in Louisville, Kentucky.

## Rick Stein, Head Coach



Rick Stein '92 needs just seven wins to become the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball program's all-time leader in victories as he enters his 10th season at the helm of the Screaming Eagles.

Stein, in 17 seasons as an assistant coach and head coach for USI women's basketball, has had a hand in 312 of the program's 460 victories (67.8 percent of USI's all-time wins).

The 2001 GLVC Coach of the Year has been a major factor in four conference championships, three GLVC Tournament titles, all seven of USI's NCAA II Tournament appearances, and two NCAA II Elite Eight appearances.

In 2008-09, Stein will have a solid group of returning players and an excellent recruiting class to mix together as he looks to get the Eagles back to the top of one of the toughest conferences in Division II.

Last season, Stein's Eagles were one of the most competitive groups in the GLVC despite their 10-17 overall mark and 5-14

record in league play. His team held second-half leads in nearly every contest in a league that featured six NCAA II Tournament teams and the 2008 national champions.

In 2006-07, Stein guided the Eagles to a 16-12 overall record, 10-9 in the GLVC, and back to the GLVC Tournament. His squad also earned a victory over eventual NCAA II Great Lakes Region champion Drury University.

The 2005-06 season saw Stein lead the Eagles to a 15-15 overall record, 7-12 in the GLVC, despite losing nearly 70 percent of his team's offensive output and nearly 80 percent of his squad's rebounding output from the previous season.

His squad battled through multiple injuries to post a 14-14 overall record, 7-13 in the GLVC, and qualify for the GLVC Tournament in 2004-05.

In 2003-04, Stein led the Eagles to the program's seventh twenty-win season, posting a 20-10 mark and a 12-8 record in the GLVC. His Eagles returned to the NCAA II Tournament for the seventh time in the program's history, the third-most of any women's program in GLVC history.

Despite a rough 2002-03 campaign, Stein and his coaching staff brought in a strong recruiting class that set the stage for a return





to national competitiveness. In 2003-04, USI had the sixth-best turnaround in Division II, with USI improving by 12 wins from the previous year.

In 2002-03, Stein and the Eagles were forced into a rebuilding year after losing five seniors and more than 60 points and 25 rebounds per game from the 2001-02 squad. With only one returning starter, Stein and his staff had a young team competing for a spot in the GLVC Tournament late in the season and finished the year with an 8-19 overall record.

The 2001-02 season saw Stein's Eagles post a 27-6 overall record, 16-4 GLVC, win a second straight GLVC Championship, and appear in the NCAA II Great Lakes Region Tournament for the second straight season. Stein also led the Eagles into the national spotlight with his squad being ranked nationally for 37 consecutive weeks between December 2000 and December 2002.

In just his second season at the helm, Stein led USI to a 28-4 record and the biggest season-to-season turnaround in school history (+13 wins). Stein, who earned GLVC Coach of the Year honors, directed the Eagles to the GLVC Championship, GLVC Tournament Championship, an NCAA II Tournament appearance, and an appearance in the NCAA II Elite Eight for the second time in the program's history.

Stein went 15-12 overall in 1999-00, tying the record for most victories for a rookie head coach and setting the record for best winning percentage for a rookie coach (.556).

A member of the WBCA, Stein is a 1992 USI graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration. He joined the Eagles' program in 1991-92 as a student assistant under former Head Coach Chancellor Dugan. He was promoted to head assistant coach in 1994 and promptly helped Dugan and the Eagles to their best season as a varsity sport at USI.

In his eight seasons as an assistant, Stein helped Dugan amass a 159-73 record with four straight NCAA II Tournament appearances (1994-95 to 1997-98) and three GLVC titles. The Eagles were the NCAA II Tournament finalist and produced the first perfect season in GLVC history (20-0) in 1997.

A native of Crete, Illinois, Stein was a two-year starter on USI's men's basketball team from 1989-91. During his tenure as a player, Stein helped USI to an appearance in the NCAA II South Central Region Tournament in 1989-90 and a win over Division I University of Wisconsin in 1990-91. Before joining USI's team, he played basketball at Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois, and earned an associate degree. Parkland finished as the NJCAA Division II runner-up in 1988 and fourth nationally in 1989.

Stein and his wife Kari have a son, Alex, and a daughter, Mallorie.

In 2001-02, Head Coach **Rick Stein** led the Screaming Eagles to their second straight Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament title.

In 17 seasons with the USI women's basketball team, eight as an assistant and eight as head coach, Stein has been a part of 312 Eagle victories, seven NCAA II Tournament appearances, four regular-season GLVC titles, and a record three GLVC Tournament championships.

Stein has been a part of 67.8 percent of USI's all-time victories.

In just his second season, Stein was voted the GLVC Coach of the Year after leading USI to a 28-4 record and both the GLVC regular-season and tournament championships.

Stein, who led USI to its second NCAA II Elite Eight appearance in 2000-01, ranks second all-time at USI with 153 career victories and is the third coach in the program's history to reach the 100-win plateau.





## Randa Gatling, Assistant Coach



Assistant Coach **Randa Gatling '99** returns for her 10th season with the Screaming Eagles. Gatling assists in all aspects of the USI women's basketball program. In particular, she works closely with game scouts, recruiting, player assessments, and on-the-court skill work with the guards.

Gatling has been a major part of USI's success throughout the years, both as a player and as a coach. She has been a part of 253 victories, 153 as a coach and 100 as a player. In

addition, Gatling has been a part of seven NCAA II Tournament teams, two NCAA II Elite Eight squads, and five GLVC championship teams.

In addition to her coaching duties, Gatling is USI's senior woman administrator and an instructor in physical education. She also is the coordinator for USI's Eagle Math program.

A native of Evansville, Indiana, Gatling started her career at Evansville Central High School. She served as the head coach

for the first-ever Central girl's freshman basketball team and was instrumental in its creation.

Gatling graduated from USI in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in social work.

During her playing days at USI, Gatling was a member of the 1997 NCAA Division II national finalist team. Her play helped the Eagles to NCAA II Tournament appearances in 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998, as well as GLVC championships in 1995, 1997, and 1998. She was the team captain in 1997-98.

The Eagles were a dominating 100-16 (.862), including an amazing 67-9 (.881) in the GLVC, during Gatling's four years in an Eagle uniform.



As a player and a coach, **Randa Gatling** has helped lead the Screaming Eagles to 253 wins, five GLVC championships, three GLVC Tournament championships, two NCAA II Elite Eight appearances, and the 1997 NCAA II Finals.

During her playing career at USI, the Eagles were a dominating 100-16, including 67-9 in the GLVC.

## Michelle Irwin, Assistant Coach



**Michelle Irwin** enters her third season with the USI women's basketball team. She assists in all aspects of the USI women's basketball program. In particular, she works closely with game scouts, recruiting, player assessments, and on-the-court skill work with the post players.

Irwin came to USI from Ashland University, where she was a graduate assistant from 2004-06. She helped the Ashland Eagles to an NCAA II Tournament appearance, two Great

Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference South Division titles, and two 20-win seasons.

Prior to Ashland, Irwin got her coaching start at St. Catharine College during the 2003-04 season. She helped in recruiting, player development, and scouting reports while at SCC.

Irwin played for USI Head Coach Rick Stein from 1999-02 and was part of the Screaming Eagles' back-to-back GLVC Tournament championship teams. USI amassed a 70-22 mark,

43-17 in the GLVC, during Irwin's three seasons in a USI uniform. The Eagles also appeared in the NCAA II Tournament twice.

The Louisville, Kentucky, native averaged 5.9 points and 4.6 rebounds per game for the Eagles, including a career-best 7.9 points and 5.5 rebounds during USI's NCAA II Elite Eight run in 2000-01.

Irwin, who also teaches in the Physical Education Department at USI, earned a bachelor's degree in marketing with a minor in international business from the University of Louisville in 2004. She graduated with a master's degree in sports sciences from Ashland in December of 2005.



**Michelle Irwin** was a key player for the Screaming Eagles during their back-to-back GLVC Tournament championship runs in 2000-01 and 2001-02. In Irwin's three seasons in a USI uniform, the Eagles were 70-22 overall, 43-17 in the GLVC.

As a player and coach, Irwin has been part of three NCAA II Tournament appearances.

University of Southern Indiana's Department of Athletics is in the national spotlight for its athletic accomplishments in the NCAA Division II and in the Evansville-area spotlight as partners in the community.

The program is designed around the Eagle Math booklets printed in the first quarter, second quarter, third quarter, and fourth quarter sequence to carry out the sports theme.

As student athletes practice to get better, math students are encouraged to practice math to excel in the classroom. A local bank provides incentive for the students. Each student who completes the math booklet is offered a savings account with a \$10 deposit.

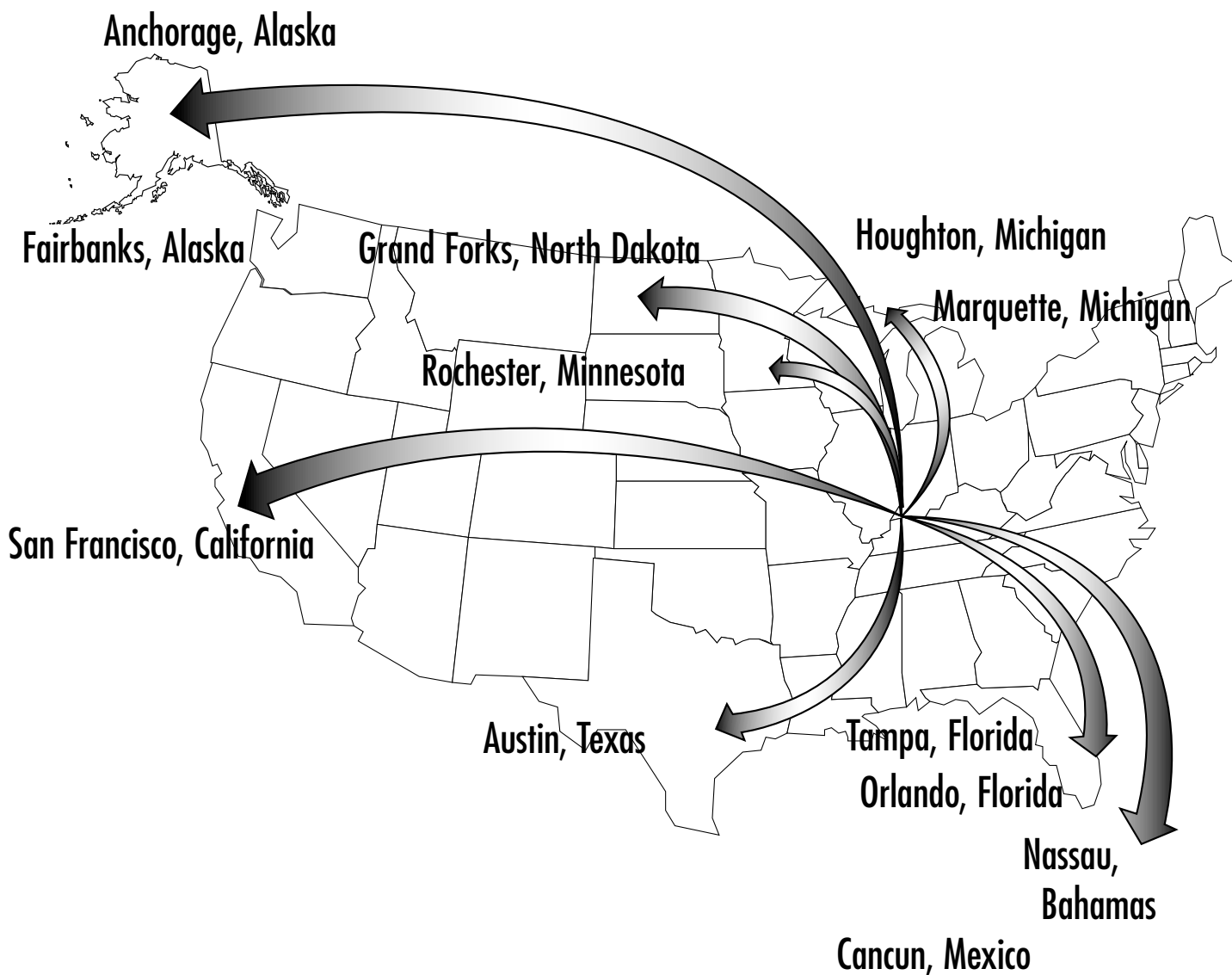

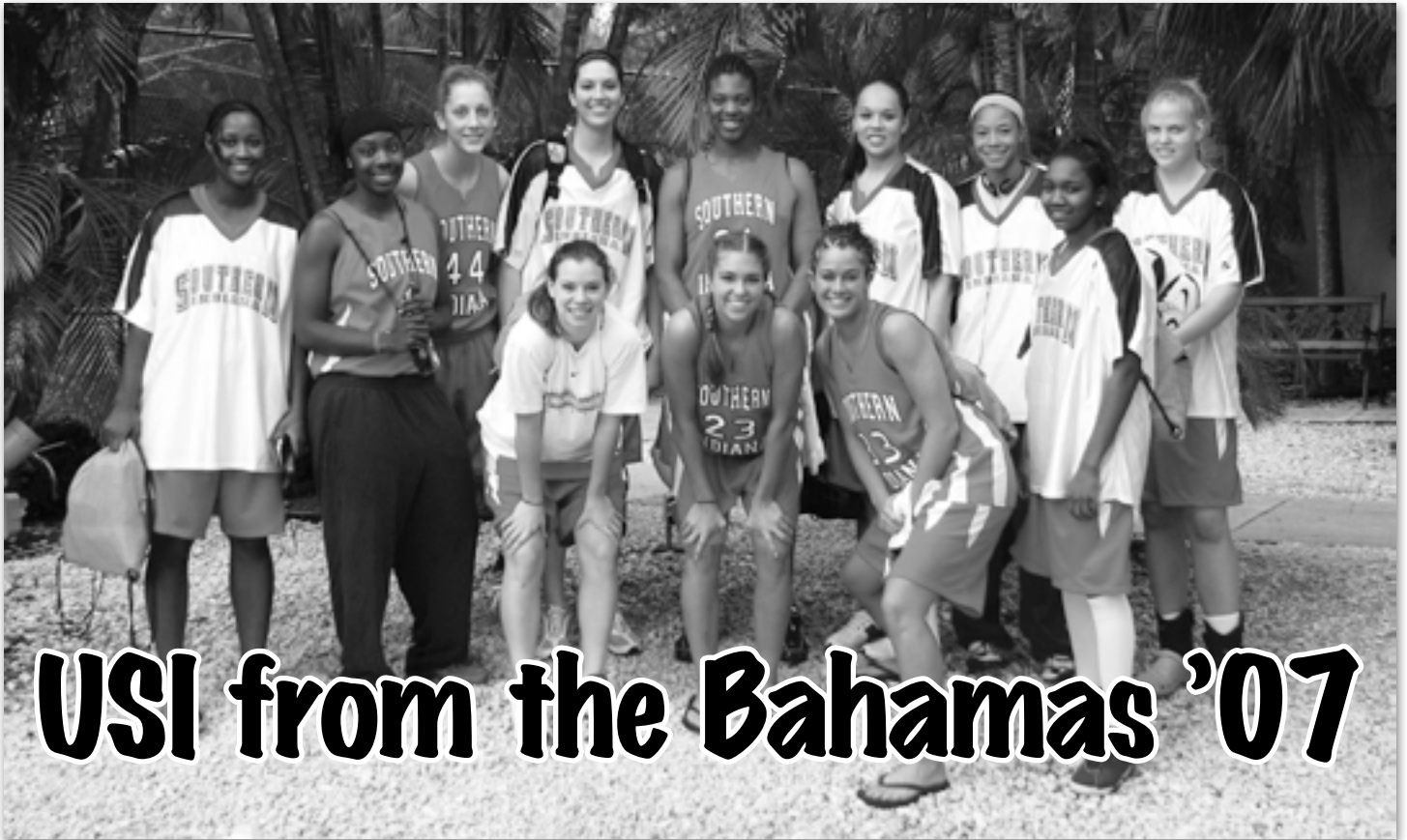

## Soaring through the years of success

The University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team enters the 2008-09 campaign seeking its eighth NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 14 seasons. The last 14 seasons have not only produced seven NCAA II Tournament appearances, but have seen the Screaming Eagles make it to the NCAA II Sweet Sixteen three times and to the Elite Eight twice. USI finished as the runner-up in 1997.

In addition to its NCAA II Tournament success, USI also has been a powerhouse in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. The Eagles have won four GLVC regular-season titles since 1995 and have won the GLVC Tournament a record-tying three times. In eight trips to the GLVC Tournament, the Eagles are 10-5.

*Note: Since 1994, the Eagles have had five players earn All-America honors.*

After beginning the 1996-97 season with a 1-1 record, the Eagles won 29 straight games as well as the GLVC and NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Championship. USI went on to win its first two games in the NCAA II Elite Eight before falling in the national championship game to North Dakota. USI also became the first and only team in GLVC history to go 20-0 in conference play. USI finished the season with a school-record 30-2 mark and finished second in the national rankings.

After missing out on the NCAA II Tournament in 1999 and 2000, the Eagles exploded back on to the national stage in 2001. The Eagles finished the 2000-01 season with a 28-4 mark and won a share of the GLVC regular-season title. The Eagles went on to win the GLVC Tournament championship as well as the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Championship for the second time in school history.

**Quick fact:** The Eagles have hosted the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament twice. However, the two times the Eagles have gone to the Elite Eight, they have won the regional tournament in the state of Michigan.





## All-American Impact



**Kathy Lauck** was the first of five USI players to earn All-America honors since 1994. Lauck averaged 20.1 points and 9.2 rebounds per game as a senior and led the Screaming Eagles to their first winning season in eight years. USI finished the season with a 17-10 mark and a 12-6 record in the GLVC. Lauck, who is third all-time at USI in career scoring with 1,573 points, earned GLVC Player of the Year honors in 1994 and was a two-time All-GLVC selection. She was recognized by three publications for All-America honors.



In 1995, **LeAnn Freeland** became the second player in school history to earn All-America honors. Freeland, USI's all-time leading scorer with 2,269 points, finished her career at USI as a three-time All-American. However, her sophomore campaign in 1994-95 stood out as she became the first player in school history to earn National Player of the Year honors. During the 1994-95 season, Freeland averaged 24.4 points and 9.2 points per game. She finished her career as USI's all-time leader in six statistical categories, including rebounds (961). The two-time GLVC Player of the Year holds 16 school records and was a three-time Academic All-American.



**Eileen Weber** was recognized by two organizations for All-America honors in 1996-97. She also earned All-America honors for her efforts during the 1997-98 season. In 1996-97, Weber helped lead the Screaming Eagles to a 30-2 record and the NCAA II National Championship game. She started her career at USI by earning GLVC Newcomer of the Year honors and ended it by earning GLVC Player of the Year honors. Weber is second all-time at USI in career points (1,847) and career rebounds (842). She averaged 17.8 points and 8.0 rebounds per game as a senior in 1997-98 and 15.4 points and 6.4 rebounds as a junior in 1996-97.



After a quiet first three seasons, **Elizabeth Prewett** broke out as a senior during the 2000-01 season. She averaged 15.0 points and 9.2 rebounds per game to lead USI to a 28-4 record and its second trip to the NCAA II Elite Eight. Her efforts landed her first-team All-GLVC and All-Region honors. She also was selected GLVC All-Tournament Team and was named the MVP of the 2001 NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament. Prewett is ranked 14th all-time at USI in career scoring (837) and eighth all-time at USI in career rebounds (589). In 2000, she helped the USI volleyball team to a share of the GLVC regular-season title.
