NEW FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATORS. Several new faculty members and administrators have joined the ISUE staff this fall. They are:

James H. Bandoli as assistant professor of biology. He received a B.S. degree in 1974 from the University of San Diego and an M.S. from Northern Arizona University in 1977. He is currently working toward a Ph.D. from the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque. Before joining the ISUE staff, he worked as a teaching associate at the University of New Mexico.

George S. Berger as an instructor in economics. The New Jersey native graduated in 1968 from the Moravian College in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. He worked as a graduate student at the University of California at Davis before joining the staff of ISUE.

Mark G. Bial as instructor in physical education and assistant men's basketball coach. He comes to ISUE from Northland College in Ashland, Wisconsin. MAJOR MEDICAL/DENTAL CLAIMS. A notice has been received from Equitable concerning the cancellation of the University major medical/dental master policy effective September 30, 1981:

"Even though your group coverage terminated with The Equitable several months ago and your plan provides that proof of claim must be submitted within 90 days of the date of loss we have administratively accepted claims that have been presented.

A final accounting must soon be made, therefore claims received after September 30, 1982, will not be accepted and will be declined because of late filing."

To assure that any expense for medical and/or dental charges incurred on or prior to September 30, 1981, are considered for reimbursement by Equitable, such charges should be submitted to the Personnel Office immediately. Charges incurred prior to September 30, 1981, but filed after September 30, 1982, will be rejected under the terms of the cancellation of the master policy.

Major medical and dental charges incurred October 1, 1981, and after, will be considered under the new combined Blue Cross-Blue Shield master policy. Any questions concerning the Equitable claims deadline should be directed to Darlene Fisher at extension 1790.
