All-Sports Trophy

ISUE captured the Great Lakes Valley Conference All-Sports Trophy last season. The Eagles accumulated 44 points, outdistancing Kentucky Wesleyan's total of 38 points. Indiana Central placed third with 36 points, followed by Lewis (35½ points), Bellarmine (31½ points), St. Joseph's (26 points), and Ashland (19 points).

The Eagles won conference championships in baseball, cross country, soccer, and women's tennis. The golf team took second in the conference tournament, while the men's tennis team placed third in their tournament. The men's basketball team placed fourth in the conference standings. The women's basketball and volleyball teams placed fifth in their conference tournaments.

ISUE also led the conference in individuals selected to all-conference teams. The Eagles had 19 all-conference selections, compared to 18 for Lewis, 16 for Indiana Central and 15 for Kentucky Wesleyan. The women's tennis team earned five all-conference selections, while the soccer and cross country teams each had four all-conference performers.



In a very short period, ISUE teams have participated in national tournaments, won conference titles and tournaments and individual athletes have received conference and national recognition for their outstanding performances. They have, through their athletic achievements, helped to point out the overall excellence which we are seeking.

We are proud of the accomplishments of our student-athletes. At the same time, we are equally pleased with the general excellence which is reflected by our attractive campus, our buildings, equipment and most of all, by the quality of our faculty and all our students.

Whether you are an Evansville native, a prospective student, or an out-of-town visitor, we welcome you to Indiana State University Evansville and hope your stay in Eagle Country will be most enjoyable.



ISUE is a learning experience for everyone. Its class-schedule is flexible and diversified enough to provide everyone a good college education.

Located in southwestern Indiana, Indiana State University Evansville serves the Tri-State area of Indiana, Kentucky and Illinois, providing academic offerings in baccalaureate and associate degree programs. ISUE also offers credit and noncredit continuing education classes, professional seminars and workshops and special short-course sessions throughout the year through the Office of Continuing Education and General Studies. Selected graduate programs of Indiana State University-Terre Haute are also available on the Evansville campus. The University's Office of Cooperative Professional Practice offers students career-related work experiences with participating area business and industry.

Indiana State University Evansville is accredited by the North Central Association, the National Council of Accreditation of Teacher Education, the Indiana State Department of American Dental Association and the Accreditation Board for Engineering Technology.

ISUE opened its doors to 412 students at the Centennial School in 1965. Today, entering its 18th year of service, the school's enrollment has grown to 3,500 students and its academic degree programs now number more than 70. In 1968, Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., raised funds to purchase 1,400 acres of land for the Mid-American University Center, with the first structure, the Science and Administration building, opening its doors in the fall of that year. The Library opened in 1971, followed by the University Center in 1974 and the Technology Center in 1975. Officials proudly cut the ribbon on the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building in October, 1980. Constructed at a cost of more than \$4 million, the building accommodates a variety of instructional activities and services, and provides an on-campus arena for ISUE athletic events.

The Evansville campus is a part of the two-campus system of Indiana State University-Terre Haute. The university has a strong history of service to the State of Indiana since 1870. Richard G. Landini serves as president of the University and David L. Rice is president of the Evansville campus.

A NEW GENERATION ON THE WAY

A balanced mix of returning players and newcomers should make for an interesting season of ISUE basketball. Eight newcomers join six returning players to form the 1983-84 Screaming Eagle basketball squad.

1982-83 LEDGER: The ISUE basketball team finished the season 15-13, and was in the running for a NCAA tournament bid until the last week of the season. The Eagles finished fourth in the GLVC with a 5-7 league mark. ISUE defeated Division I foes Western Michigan (101-99 in four overtimes), Austin Peay (58-54), and Eastern Illinois (81-78). Also the Eagles defeated league opponents Lewis (80-79), Bellarmine (88-86), and St. Joseph's (67-65). Offensively the outstanding game of the season was a 139-113 victory over Indiana Central. In that contest the Eagles shot .770 from the field and broke twelve school records.

RETURNEES: Point guard Kent Payne is the only returning starter from last year's squad. The senior from Schaumburg, IL. averaged 7.2 points and 6.6 assists per game. He holds a GLVC record for assists in a game (16 vs. Indiana Central), and an ISUE record for assists in a season (169). In the last two games of the season Payne scored 35 points and handed out 24 assists. Sophomore forward Chuck Gans was voted the Most Improved Eagle on the team last season. The 6-7 Merrillville, Ind. product averaged 4.8 points per game over the last seven games of the year compared to 2.9 points per contest over the entire schedule. His outstanding game of the year was at Northern Kentucky where he scored eight points and took five caroms. Gans was one


of the better shooters a year ago, shooting .542 from the field and .667 from the line. Bill Meade (another 6-7 forward from Merrillville, IN) also improved as the season progressed. He averaged 1.7 points and 0.9 rebounds per outing in his freshman season. Three Evansville, IN products will also be returning to the 1983-84 team. Eric Harris should be a factor this season, averaging 1.8 points and 0.8 rebounds last year. Brad Fraser will be a hardnosed defensive player for the Eagles. Fraser is also a good shot, putting in .583 of his field goal attempts. Rick Eberhard should also see increased playing time in his second collegiate season.

TRANSFERS: Three junior college transfers should contribute immediately to the ISUE basketball effort. Bob Burns averaged 18.3 points and 9.8 rebounds per game last season at Ellsworth Junior College (IA). In addition, he handed out 89 assists. Burns was selected second team all-region in his sophomore season. Scott Newlin (cousin of NBA star Mike) is an excellent shot, averaging 14.5 points per outing last year. He shot 64 percent from the field and 80 percent from the line a year ago. Also, he averaged 6.7 assists per contest, and was selected as Frederick Community College's (MD) best defensive player. Fred McFall averaged ten points and four rebounds per game for his 26-9 Olney Junior College (IL) team. Also a fine team player, he averaged 7 assists last year.

NEWCOMERS: Five newcomers begin their careers at ISUE this season. Jeff Brownfield led his Indian Creek team to the semistate before loosing to eventual champion Connersville. The 6-7 forward averaged 20.2 points and 12.8 rebounds. He shot .615 from the field and .861 from the line in his senior season. Steve Jackson was player-of-the-year in Ft. Wayne. The 6-1 guard was selected honorable mention all-state on the strength of a 22 point scoring average. Also, he led his Southside team to a 18-5 record in the last campaign. Brad Pemberton played at nearby Tecumseh High School. As a senior, the 6-6 forward averaged 21.5 points and 10.5 boards per contest. He was also in the top ten percent of his graduating class academically. Corey Partridge was honorable mention all-state in Illinois. Partridge contributed 17.5 points and 9.8 caroms to the Eldorado High School team last year. David Schnapf (6-7, 220) is coming off a red-shirt season, and will provide considerable board strength.

LOSSES: ISUE lost four double figure scorers last season. Cully Nelson put in 17.1 points and grabbed 9.0 rebounds per game last season. He ended his career as the school's all-time leading rebounder and third all-time leading scorer. His .618 career field goal percentage is also an ISUE record. Clarence James averaged 15.6 points per contest, while Kelly Williams averaged 15.1 points and Jeff Pennington averaged 15.0 points. Also gone are sixth man Bob Webber and Jeff Strouse.

CREIGHTON BURNS

Coach Creighton Burns is entering his fourth year as a member of the faculty and staff at ISUE. The 1983-84 season will be Coach Burns' third season as mentor of the Screaming Eagle basketball team. During his first two seasons as head coach the Eagles complied a 31 and 25 record and won their first ever international game. In addition to coaching basketball, Coach Burns is the director of athletics and serves as a physical education instructor.


A native of Cromwell, Indiana, Burns was a two sport award winner at Purdue University, winning awards in both basketball and baseball. After graduating from Purdue in 1964, Burns signed a professional baseball contract with the Minnesota Twins. Burns pitched in the Twins organization until 1967, when an arm injury ended his career.

In 1967, Coach Burns started his coaching career, and coached at Triton High School, Clinton Central High School, North Newton High School and Twin Lakes High School before becoming assistant basketball coach at Armstrong State College, located in Savannah, Georgia. Armstrong State reached the national number one ranking during each of the two years that Burns spent there.

Coach Burns and his wife Darlene have two children; Chris, 17 and Betsi, 10. The Burns family attend the West Side Christian Church and Creighton is also a member of the Masonic Lodge (Cromwell Lodge #705), the Scottish Rite and the Mizpah Shrine Temple (Fort Wayne). Burns is also a member of the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association, the National Association of Basketball Coaches and recently became a member of Phi Delta Kappa, the national education fraternity.

Mark Bial is entering his second year as the ISUE assistant basketball coach. Though he is only 29-years old, Bial has eight years of coaching experience, three of those years in the Big Ten.

Bial is a Danville, Illinois native where he prepped at Schlarman High School, lettering in basketball, football, and track. From there he attended the University of Illinois where he majored in physical education with an English minor.


From 1978-80 Bial served as a graduate assistant at Illinois under Lou Henson. At Illinois he both recruited players and scouted opponents. In 1979 Illinois rose to a number three national ranking.


At the age of 25 Bial became the head coach and athletic director at Northland College in Ashland, Wisconsin. In his three years there, Bial rebuilt the athletic department and took the basketball team from two victories to a winning season, playing one of the toughest NAIA schedules in the country.

Johnson County Player-of-the-year . . . led his team to a 21-4 record last season.

Great Lakes Valley Conference

The Great Lakes Valley Conference has quickly established itself as a basketball force in the NCAA Division II ranks during the past four years.

With its members consistently ranked among the nation's best, last year's Kentucky Wesleyan squad showed just how far the GLVC has come nationally. Kentucky Wesleyan, and Lewis, received NCAA Division II tournament bids.

Conference parity was the key last year, with any of the seven members able to knock off the others on any given night.

Under the leadership of athletic directors, Richard Scharf of St. Josephs and James Spaulding of Bellarmine, the original six conference members met in Louisville, Kentucky on July 7, 1978. It was there that these members; Ashland College of Ashland, Ohio; Bellarmine of Louisville, Kentucky; Indiana Central of Indianapolis, Indiana; Kentucky Wesleyan of Owensboro, Kentucky; St. Josephs of Renesselaer, Indiana; and Indiana State University of Evansville met and approved the final constitution and by laws for what had become the Great Lakes Valley Conference. In April, 1980, Lewis of Romeoville, Illinois, became the seventh member of the conference.

Basketball is only one of the six men's sports offered by the GLVC. Conference championships are also held in baseball, cross country, golf, soccer and tennis.

During the 83-84 year, conference schools will vie for championships in women's tennis, basketball and volleyball.

Excellent basketball will once again be the standard for the 1982-83 season.


