RECORD ENROLLMENT. Indiana State University Evansville is announcing a record enrollment for the 1975 fall semester. The enrollment figures reflect a 14.7% increase with 1975 figures totaling 2,945 students as compared to the 1974 figure of 2,568. The largest increase was noted in the freshman class, with 1,395 freshmen enrolled this year. Last year, the freshman figure was 978. Other totals are sophomores, 563, juniors, 495, and seniors, 461. The Evansville Campus has 1,268 females enrolled and 1,677 males enrolled this fall semester.
